A NPDES permit is required for any discharge of stormwater or wastewater from wastewater treatment systems to area drainage channels at Boeing's Santa Susana Field Laboratory. A NPDES permit sets limits for particular pollutants in and establishes monitoring and reporting requirements for storm- and wastewater discharges. Additionally, it provides the framework required for enforcement of NPDES discharge limits.

During the *Open House* you will have the opportunity to informally talk with the Regional Board's Executive Officer and technical staff about the:

- Purpose and significance of a NPDES permit
- *Proposed* NPDES permit requirements for the SSFL
- How the *proposed* NPDES permit requirements protect surface and ground water quality

During the *Roundtable Discussion*, staff will discuss in a more formal setting the technical aspects of the *proposed* NPDES permit.
