CITY OF DUNSMUIR
WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT
SISKIYOU AND SHASTA COUNTIES

The City of Dunsmuir (Discharger) owns and operates a wastewater treatment plant (Facility) on South First Street in Dunsmuir, Siskiyou County and Shasta County. The wastewater treatment plant consists of an aerated grit chamber, comminutor, oxidation ditch, secondary clarifier, sand filter, chlorine contact chamber, dechlorinator system, and sludge drying beds. The Facility discharges treated wastewater to the Sacramento River. The discharge from the Facility is currently regulated pursuant to Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 5-00-124 and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CA0078441. The Discharger submitted a Report of Waste Discharge and applied for a NPDES permit renewal to continue discharging up to 0.41 million gallons per day (mgd) of treated wastewater from the Facility to the Sacramento River.

A public hearing concerning this matter will be held during the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) meeting, which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- City of Dunsmuir

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Regional Board no later than **22 October 2006**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item must submit testimony, evidence, and or comments in writing to the Regional Board no later than **22 October 2006**. Written testimony, evidence, or comments submitted after **22 October 2006** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Regional Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross-examination will be limited in time by the Regional Board Chair.
