

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
and
NOTICE OF FILING OF DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTS**

concerning
Amendments to the Water Quality Control Plan for
the Sacramento River and San Joaquin River Basins to
Establish Site-Specific Water Quality Objectives for Chloroform,
Chlorodibromomethane, and Dichlorobromomethane for New Alamo and Ulatis
Creeks and Permit Implementation Provisions

The Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board) will hold a public hearing to consider adoption of the proposed amendments to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Basins (Basin Plan) to establish site-specific water quality standards to protect human health for chloroform, chlorodibromomethane, and dichlorobromomethane for New Alamo and Ulatis Creeks, in Solano County, and to establish implementation provisions. After hearing testimony, the Central Valley Water Board may choose to act on the proposal, select an alternative evaluated in the Staff Report, select an alternative with revisions, or may choose to continue or close the hearing and vote on the proposal at a future meeting. The public hearing, to be conducted during the 26, 27 or 28 May 2010 Central Valley Water Board meeting, is scheduled at the time and location noted below:

On 28 June 2007, staff conducted a California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Scoping Meeting to receive comments from the public on issues that should be considered in amending the Basin Plan.
