

To Whom It May Concern:

I have a serious conflict with the approval of the von Bargaen's Artois Dump Site. I guess I can say I was surprised to hear after having built a site which provides a clean and safe environment that can handle all septic waste, including chemical portable toilets, holding vaults from public rest stops and public camp grounds and yellow grease waste from restaurants, all which has been dumped at the von Bargaen's Artois Dump Site in the past.

My company Nor-Cal Environmental Solutions, Inc. DBA Nor-Cal Septic & Trench Work has been dumping at this unregulated site since 1995 until February 2010. Never has anyone tested the pH of any sewage dumped on the open land at that point. No test had been conducted by the von Bargaen's, The County of Glenn, or the California Regional Water Quality Control Board.

I am also one of the owner and operators of Nor-Cal Environmental Solutions, LLC. in Orland. We are a State of California licensed dewatering site. Our facility was built to improve environmental handling of septic waste and because open land application would be closed because of various health issues, vector control, waste products that don't go away such as feminine hygiene products, not to mention needles, plastic etc.

Included with my letter is an overview of how our plant works and where it's located. We are contracted with the City of Orland to pay them a price per gallon to discharge the effluent. We pay Glenn County Planning & Public Works Conditional Use Permit Road Impact Fee, a tax for the amount of product that is delivered at our plant. At the current time our dried material is tested for heavy metals, moisture content, BODS, TSS by California Laboratory Services in Rancho Cordova. Our dried materials are then hauled to Recology Dump Site on Ostrom Road Wheatland, CA.

At this time we are working with Compost Solutions to change their discharge permit so it can be composted, not to further impact a County dump facility. We are also working with North Star Engineering out of Chico, CA and Orenco Products out of Portland Oregon on further cleaning up the effluent waste water to use in a sub service drip irrigation in Butte County where there is no City pond access.

In conclusion, if you consider everything that is discharged out of a septic truck that is not normal septic tank waste, there are numerous health issues.
