**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

concerning

**WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR**

**SHASTA COUNTY AND CITY OF REDDING  
WEST CENTRAL CLASS III MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE LANDFILL  
SHASTA COUNTY**

Shasta County owns the West Central Class III Municipal Solid Waste Landfill (West Central Landfill), located near the community of Igo, southwest of Redding, Shasta County. The City of Redding manages day-to-day operations pursuant to an agreement with Shasta County. Shasta County and the City of Redding are collectively referred to as Discharger. Landfill operations began in 1982. The total landfill area covers approximately 1,250 acres. West Central Landfill has three waste management units (Units), including the 22-acre Phase 1 Unit which closed in 1992, the currently operating Phase 2 Unit which is being developed in sub-Units and will have a total area covering 100 acres (approximately 72 acres currently contains waste), and the 450,000 gallon Class II surface impoundment (Unit 3) for storage and evaporation of leachate. Associated facilities at the site include an in-fill gas collection and control system with flare, an unclassified unlined waste tire Unit that's no longer active and has a soil final cover in place, a clean wood diversion area, an inert material diversion area, two scales, a scale house, a public drop-off and recycling area, a shop building, four contact water impoundments, six storm water detention ponds, and two storm water retention ponds. A paved road exists from the front entrance, past the scale house and public drop-off area, leading to the shop building and around the north, west, and south perimeter of the Phase 2 Unit. West Central Landfill currently operates under Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R5-2005-0068. Order No. R5-2005-0068 is being revised to require implementation of corrective actions in response to a release of waste to groundwater. Corrective actions proposed by the Discharger and required by the revised Order include partial final closure of the western portion of the Phase 2 Unit and infill extraction of landfill gases.

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) will consider adopting the revised Order. A public hearing to address this matter will be held during the Central Valley Water Board meeting which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- Central Valley Water Board Staff
- Shasta County
- City of Redding

Designated parties but not interested persons will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if

the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **27 April 2015**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The tentative Waste Discharge Requirements and Monitoring and Reporting Program were issued on **27 March 2015**. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 27 April 2015**. Written materials submitted after 5:00 p.m. on the above date will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Board.
