NOTICE OF INTENT DRAFT INITIAL STUDY/NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR CITY OF LEMOORE WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITY AND LEPRINO FOODS COMPANY RIVER RANCH RECYCLED WATER PROJECT KINGS COUNTY

TO ALL CONCERNED PERSONS AND AGENCIES

Enclosed is a draft Initial Study and Negative Declaration (IS/ND) for the City of Lemoore Wastewater Treatment Facility and Leprino Foods Company's River Ranch Recycled Water Project (Project). The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (or Central Valley Water Board) will consider approving the Negative Declaration at its 15/16 February 2024 Board Meeting.

Project Description: The Project will expand the use of recycled water by allowing an increase in the discharge of combined effluent from 5.0 to 7.0 million gallons per day (mgd) for irrigation of crops in place of existing water resources. The combined effluent consists of treated effluent from the City of Lemoore's Wastewater Treatment Facility (Lemoore WWTF) and cheese production water from the Leprino Foods Company (Leprino's) two cheese processing plants. Recycled water will be treated to meet Title 22 requirements for disinfected secondary-23. In addition, the Project will expand the land application area at River Ranch (owned by Leprino) from 1,900 to approximately 2,400 acres. Crops grown on the land application area will include animal fodder and cotton crops as well as tomatoes (for tomato paste). Recycled water will be transported to River Ranch via an existing recycled water pipeline.

Location: River Ranch is in northwestern Kings County, approximately four miles west of Lemoore (Latitude 36°19' 11.44" N, Longitude 119° 53' 34.98" W) just east of the Lemoore Naval Air Station and adjacent to the Crescent Bypass and South Fork of the Kings River

as shown in **Attachment 1**. River Ranch is comprised of approximately 2,400 acres of existing farmland (previously known as the Stone Ranch and Nederend Properties).

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Review: The 30-day public comment period for the IS/ND begins on 15 November 2023 and ends on 15 December 2023. Any written comments or evidence you may have concerning these items must be submitted to this office by 5:00 pm on
15 December 2023. Absent a showing of good cause and lack of prejudice to other parties, the Board Chair may exclude comments and evidence received after this deadline.

To conserve paper and reduce mailing costs, a paper copy of these items has been sent only to the Dischargers. Others are advised that copies of the IS/ND will be available within the next couple of days on the Central Valley Water Board's <u>Tentative Orders</u> <u>website</u> under the heading, "Discharger-Specific Order for Future Board Meetings" (https://www.waterboards.ca.gov/centralvalley/board_decisions/tentative_orders/).


