RESCISSION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

**FOR
METHODIST CAMP WRIGHTWOOD, WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT**

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region (Water Board) finds:

1. Board Order No. 6-94-85 was adopted on August 11, 1994, establishing requirements for the discharge of treated wastewater from a package wastewater treatment plant at the Methodist Camp in Wrightwood. Waste Discharge Requirements are no longer necessary as described below and should be rescinded.
2. The treatment plant was located at the Methodist Camp on Elm Street in Wrightwood, San Bernardino County. Wastewater generated by the Camp was treated by a package wastewater treatment plant and disposed to leach fields. The camp dismantled the wastewater treatment plant and replaced it with a conventional septic tank and leachfield disposal system. An inspection conducted by Water Board staff on August 15, 2011 confirmed that the wastewater treatment plant is dismantled. Permits for subsurface disposal system are under county jurisdiction to protect public health. Ongoing discharges do not pose a threat to water quality. Therefore, it is appropriate and in the public interest to rescind Board Order No. 6-94-85.
3. This action is being taken by this regulatory agency to rescind the Board Order No. 6-94-85. Orders issued pursuant to the California Water Code and as such is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.), in accordance with Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 15321(a)(2).
4. The Water Board has notified the Discharger and interested persons and agencies of its intent to rescind the above Waste Discharge Requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Board Order No. 6-94-85, be rescinded.
