ORDER NO. 81-~~49~~ 75

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
NORGE VILLAGE DRY CLEANERS
Yucca Valley - San Bernardino County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. Leslie A. Jones (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), 56439 29 Palms Highway, Yucca Valley, CA 92284 submitted a Report of Waste Discharger dated January 9, 1980.
2. The discharger is discharging a maximum of 10,000 gallons-per-day of washwater from a laundromat. The wastewater is discharged into six lint traps and disposed of by means of eight seepage pits. The site is located in the SE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 35, T1N, R5E, SBB&M. Domestic sewage from three restrooms is discharged into a separate septic tank/seepage pit system.
3. The discharger proposes to expand the disposal facilities by installing 12 seepage pits on an adjacent lot. The pits would be alternated which would provide adequate back-up capacity.
4. There are no domestic water wells within 200 feet of the discharge facilities described in Findings No. 2 and 3 (above).
5. The discharge from this laundromat has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 73-33. Board files reveal that the disposal system has repeatedly failed and been reworked since 1976.
6. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Joshua Tree Hydrologic Unit.
7. The beneficial uses of the groundwaters of the Joshua Tree Hydrologic Unit are:
 - a. Municipal supply
 - b. Industrial supply
8. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the discharge.

9. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.
10. This wastewater disposal system constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and Title 23, California Administrative Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter 17, Section 2715, because the governmental approvals on or after April 5, 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such (activity) than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications

1. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
2. No wastewater other than domestic sewage and laundry wastewater shall be discharged at this location.
3. Wastewater discharged subsurface shall be retained underground with no surfacing.
4. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable.
5. Septic tank and lint trap cleanings shall be discharged only by a duly authorized service.
6. Discharge of water softner brine is prohibited at this location.

B. Provisions

1. Sufficient land area shall be reserved for possible future 100 percent replacement of the seepage pits until such time as this laundromat is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
2. This Order includes the attached "Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 81-49", and future revisions thereto, as specified by the Executive Officer.
3. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.

4. Prior to any change of ownership of this laundromat, the discharger shall:
 - a. Specify as a condition of transfer that the area specified in Provision B.1. (above) remain servient to the laundromat, for the purpose of providing additional subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this laundromat is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner, in writing, of the existence of this Order, and forward a copy of said correspondence to the Regional Board.
5. This Order supersedes Board Order No. 73-33.


