ORDER NO. 2001-114
ADMINISTRATIVE ASSESSMENT OF CIVIL LIABILITY

AGAINST

CONTINENTAL MARITIME

FOR TOXICITY DISCHARGES

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region (hereinafter SDRWQCB), finds that:

1. Continental Maritime of San Diego (CMSD) discharged 348,400 gallons of acutely toxic storm water run off from its facility in violation of *Discharge Specification B.8. of Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR), Order No. 97-37, General National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CAG039002.*
2. Forty-one thousand one-hundred twenty dollars (\$41,120) is an appropriate amount of civil liability for these violations based on the factors in CWC §13385, as set forth in *Analysis of Administrative Civil Liability, Complaint No. 2001-113, Continental Maritime of San Diego, April 20, 2001.*
3. CMSD waived its right to a hearing in this matter.
4. Enforcement action is exempt from provisions of the *California Environmental Quality Act* (Public Resources Code, Division 13, Chapter 3, Section 21000 et seq.) in accordance with Section 15308, Chapter 3, Title 14 of the *California Code of Regulations.*

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that CMSD shall pay civil liability in the amount of forty-one thousand one hundred twenty dollars (**\$41,120**) for violations set forth in *Complaint No. 2001-113*.
