SUBJECT: **DEPARTMENT OF THE NAVY, FORMER MARE ISLAND NAVAL SHIPYARD, VALLEJO, SOLANO COUNTY** – Rescission of Order Nos. 85-019 and 89-088 for the Mare Island Sanitary Landfill and Industrial Waste Treatment Plant Surface Impoundments

CHRONOLOGY: Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) No. 85-019 was adopted for the Mare Island Sanitary Landfill in 1985, and Cease and Desist Order (CDO) No. 89-088 was adopted for the Mare Island Industrial Waste Treatment Plant Surface Impoundments in 1989.

DISCUSSION: The Tentative Order (Appendix A) would rescind the 1985 CAO for the closed Mare Island Sanitary Landfill, which is no longer actively accepting waste and has been remediated in accordance with a 2006 remedial action plan. Groundwater at the Sanitary Landfill is monitored under a long-term monitoring program overseen by the State's Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC). Thus, the CAO can be rescinded.

The Tentative Order would also rescind the 1989 CDO for the Mare Island Industrial Waste Treatment Plant Surface Impoundments, which are no longer receiving waste and have been remediated in accordance with a 2006 remedial action plan. Groundwater in the vicinity of the Surface Impoundments is monitored under a long-term monitoring program overseen by DTSC. Thus, the CDO can be rescinded.

The Navy has indicated its acceptance of the Tentative Order, and no comments were received on the Tentative Order during the public comment period. We have made minor formatting and editorial changes to the Tentative Order and anticipate it will remain uncontested.
