RESOLUTION NO. 70-64

DELETING THE PROVISIONS PROHIBITING ADDITIONAL  
CONNECTIONS TO THE CITY OF SAN CARLOS AND CITY OF  
BELMONT SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

WHEREAS

1. The State Water Resources Control Board has taken the following actions:
  - a. Adopted its Order 70-5 on March 14, 1970, which restricts connections to the sewer system tributary to the Treatment Plant of the City of San Carlos and the City of Belmont.
  - b. By motion of April 2, 1970, formally remanded to this Regional Board full and continuing jurisdiction over the case involving the waste discharge from this treatment plant.
2. On July 23, 1970 this Board received a staff report which described the status of the Cities' progress with respect to the above.

RESOLVED BY THIS REGIONAL BOARD

1. Accepts the above mentioned staff report as satisfactory evidence that the City of San Carlos and the City of Belmont have instituted procedures which will significantly reduce the pollution loading to the environment from their joint sewage treatment plant during the interim period until permanent facilities have been completed.
2. Amends the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 70-5 to delete the provisions prohibiting additional connections to the collection system tributary to the sewage treatment plant jointly owned by the Cities of San Carlos and Belmont.
