AMENDING SCO 90-032, SITE CLEANUP REQUIREMENTS FOR:

FMC CORPORATION-GROUND SYSTEMS DIVISION AND 495 EAST BROKAW ASSOCIATES,
495 EAST BROKAW ROAD
SAN JOSE, SANTA CLARA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (hereinafter called the Board) finds that:


1. The Board adopted site cleanup requirements 90-032 for this site on February 21, 1990.
2. On behalf of the dischargers, FMC Corporation (FMC) has been conducting remedial investigation activities and submitting required reports under Provision C.1. "Tasks".
3. FMC was not be able to submit the Remedial Alternatives and Proposals of Final Cleanup Objectives and Actions by November 30, 1991 as required in Provision C.1.e., and so notified the Executive Officer pursuant to Provision C.3. of Site Cleanup Order 90-032. FMC is conducting human-health risk assessments and researching various remedial alternatives for the final proposed cleanup plan. Site characteristics, such as the deep surface thickness of clay-rich soils, may make implementation of traditional cleanup methods impracticable or cost prohibitive.
4. FMC has requested the submittal date for the report on remedial alternatives and cleanup objectives be continued to May 30, 1992. The Board, considering the circumstances involved, find this request reasonable.
Continuing the due date to May 30, 1992 for the Remedial Alternatives report will not affect future submittals.
5. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to this item.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the discharger, in order to meet the provisions contained in Division 7 of the California Water Code and regulations adopted thereunder, shall comply with the following:

1. Provision C.1.e. of SCO 90-032 shall be revised as follows:

e. TASK: REPORT ON REMEDIAL ALTERNATIVES AND PROPOSALS OF FINAL CLEANUP OBJECTIVES AND ACTIONS
COMPLETION DATE: May 30, 1992

AMENDING SCO 91-165, SITE CLEANUP REQUIREMENTS FOR:

HEXCEL CORPORATION and F & P PROPERTIES
ABANDONED DISPOSAL SITE, NORTH MINES ROAD
LIVERMORE, ALAMEDA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (hereinafter called the Board) finds that:

1. The Board adopted site cleanup requirements 90-121 for the Abandoned Disposal Site (ADS) on August 15, 1990, and revised site cleanup requirements SCO 91-165 for Hexcel's manufacturing plant and the ADS on November 20, 1991.
2. Hexcel Corporation (Hexcel) has been conducting remedial investigation activities pursuant to existing Orders.
3. Hexcel will not be able to submit the Remedial Investigation (RI) report by March 31, 1992 as required in Provision C.1.b. of Site Cleanup Order 91-165. Delays have been encountered for site access to complete soil sampling and monitoring well installations due to rainfall in January and February, 1992.
4. Hexcel has requested the submittal date for the RI report be continued to May 18, 1992. The Board, considering the circumstances involved, find this request reasonable.

Continuing the due date to May 30, 1992 for the RI report will not affect future submittals.


5. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to this item.

ICI AMERICAS, INC.
RICHMOND, CONTRA COSTA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region, hereinafter called the Board, finds that:

1. ICI Americas Incorporated (hereinafter called the discharger) manufactures and / or formulates chemical herbicides and soil fumigants (principally: Vapam a soil fumigant, and two herbicides Devrinol and Ordram). The discharger previously did developmental work with and / or formulated other herbicides including Eptam, RO-Neet, Sutan, Tilm, Vernam and Vapam. The discharger also uses other organic based chemicals in its processes. The plant site is located in the City of Richmond at 1415 S. 47th Street.
2. A pond known as Agricultural yard pond (Ag yard pond) was previously located at the northeast corner of the agricultural formulation area of the discharger's facility. Ag yard pond was found to be subject to Toxics Pits Clean Act because of elevated level of zinc and copper found in the accumulated sludge.
3. The Board, on January 16, 1991, adopted Order 91 - 010 issuing a Site Cleanup Requirement to ICI for the closure of Ag yard pond and for groundwater monitoring through a Self Monitoring program (SMP).
4. By submitting a "Report of Closure Certification" dated December 30, 1991, ICI certified closure of Ag yard pond. Staff of this Regional Board conducted a field inspection at the site and confirmed the closure.
5. The rescission of the site cleanup requirement for closure of the pond is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Section 15308, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Order No. 91 - 010 is rescinded.
