The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (hereinafter the Board), find that:

1. **Regional Board Order:** The Board adopted final site cleanup requirements (Order No. 90-119) for the above sites on August 15, 1990. This order was adopted pursuant to Water Code Section 13304. These sites are also on the National Priority List (superfund sites).
2. **Site History:** Both Intersil and Siemens produced semiconductor related products and have used solvents on these sites. Siemens is conducting soil remediation onsite. Intersil completed soil remediation in 1993. They are both conducting groundwater remediation onsite and offsite.
3. **Report Distribution:** Pursuant to Order No. 90-119, Intersil and Siemens are required to provide a copy of all correspondence, reports, and documents pertaining to compliance with that order to U.S. EPA, Santa Clara Valley Water District, and Cities of Sunnyvale and Cupertino. In February of 1995, Intersil and Siemens in agreement with the Cities of Sunnyvale, Cupertino and Santa Clara, proposed modifications to the report distribution. Cities of Santa Clara and Sunnyvale require all reports, and City of Cupertino requires the 5-year status report only.
4. **CEQA:** This action is an amendment of an order to enforce the laws and regulations administered by the Board. As such, this action is categorically exempt from the

provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15321 of the Resources Agency Guidelines.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, pursuant to Section 13304 of the California Water Code and Section 25356.1 of the California Health and Safety Code, that order No. 90-119 is amended as following:

A. Provision 13 of Order No. 90-119 shall be revised to read:

Copies of all correspondence, reports, and documents pertaining to compliance with the Prohibition, Specifications, and Provisions of this order shall be provided to the following agencies:

- a. Santa Clara Valley Water District
- b. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency
- c. City of Santa Clara
- d. City of Sunnyvale


City of Cupertino shall be provided with the 5-year status report only.

Intersil and Seimens are encouraged to provide copies of all monitoring and remediation reports to American Microsystems Inc. AMI operates a groundwater extraction system in the area, and work performed at this site may impact their system.

The Executive Officer may modify the distribution of reports as necessary, and may additionally require copies of correspondence, reports and documents pertaining to compliance with the Prohibition, Specifications, and Provisions of this order to be provided to a local repository for public use.
