ALAMEDA COUNTY - Hearing to Consider Imposition of Amended Administrative Civil Liability (ACL) for Discharge of Bittern in Violation of the State Water Resource Control Board's Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activities, Water Quality Order No. 97-03-DWQ,

NPDES No. CAS000001

CHRONOLOGY: The Board has not previously considered this item.

DISCUSSION: In June 2005, Cargill had a bittern release of 7,100 gallons to salt marsh from

a rail tanker car at its Newark facility. Cargill has updated its procedures for

rail tanker car cleaning since the release.

As provided for under the California Water Code, I issued an ACL

Complaint for a liability of \$71,000. During the public comment period for

the Complaint, the Complaint was amended in response to four non-

substantive wording changes requested by Cargill and to describe Cargill's proposed Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP) for up to \$43,000 of the

liability (Appendix A). No other comments were received.

Cargill will undertake a SEP with the California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG) relating to the closure of wells at CDFG's Eden Landing Marsh Restoration Project along the Hayward shoreline south of the San Mateo Bridge. On July 24, Cargill waived its right to a hearing on the

amended ACL as indicated in Appendix B.
