Of the 20 inspections performed 2 sites required maintenance. Compass Transportation was inspected on March 28, 2014. Their bioretention area required extensive maintenance. They received a written Notice of Violation, for their lack of maintenance. They have until October 1, 2014 to complete repairs. Zarc Recycling was inspected on January 8 2014. Their vegetated swale required minor maintenance. Zarc received a verbal warning to complete maintenance. They have until October 1st 2014 to complete repairs. The devices that required maintenance this FY were a vegetated swale and a bioretention area. In comparison to last year we had no vault based systems that needed maintenance this FY but still found vegetation based treatment that needed maintenance. Overall most systems are kept in good order.</p>

Summary: **We have developed a spreadsheet listing all facilities and the treatment systems associated with those facilities. At this time, the City of South San Francisco has 79 treatment systems installed. The inspectors do occasionally locate additional treatment systems that are not on the spreadsheet when performing other stormwater inspections. These systems are added to the spreadsheet when they are located. Environmental Compliance Inspectors perform O&M inspections at a rate of approximately 19 devices every year. The facility list is reviewed and updated as new systems are installed and additional systems are located.**

Additionally, Inspectors participate in a quarterly creek walk along Colma Creek with County of San Mateo staff, enabling Inspectors to identify problem areas containing evidence of past discharges. Residents of South San Francisco also call the Street Department or the WQCP to report illicit discharges/potential discharges.</p> <p>The WQCP maintains a stormwater hotline for residents to report suspected illicit discharges. The hotline is publicized on the City's website, and is printed on outreach materials such as brochures, reusable shopping bags, sponges, pencils, erasers and more. The Inspectors follow up on these reports as well.</p> <p>The City of South San Francisco performed a storm system screening on June 18-30, 2014. The storm system screening covered 12 outfalls, consisting of Sonora and Ramona Streets, South Maple Stormwater Pump Station, S. Canal and S. Linden, W. Description: Inspectors regularly conduct surveillance. If they discover a mobile cleaner allowing wash water to flow to a storm drain in South San Francisco, the Inspector stops and requires any discharge to be curtailed and immediately cleaned up. Inspectors distribute and discuss required BMPs, and an NOV is generally issued. When a mobile cleaner inquires about required BMPs, we inform them of the minimum standards and direct them to the BASMAA Pollution Prevention Training Program for surface washers.

The City of South San Francisco created a brochure entitled “Wash Water Disposal Practices for Mobile Surface Cleaners” during 2009/2010. This brochure and/or the SMCWPPP brochure titled “Best Management Practices for Mobile Businesses” is given to mobile surface cleaners when issues arise in the field or when we are contacted by a mobile surface cleaner.

In order to share information on mobile business illicit discharges regionally, instances of noncompliance are entered into the recently developed Mobile Business Enforcement Information Table located on the members-only section of the SMCWPPP website.

The City contracts with Fleetwash to perform sidewalk cleaning along Grand Avenue in South San Francisco. Fleetwash is not a certified Mobile Cleaner. Fleetwash's Standard Operating Procedure is:

- Evaluate site for recovery setup and pedestrian safety. Report any visible spills or leaks to on-site representative.
- Seal all storm drains and strip drains in the washing area.
- Set up a vacuum pod system with berms and suction mat. Eliminate the possibility of any discharges to any storm drains.
- Start vacuum system.
- Pre-treat stains with surface appropriate detergent.
- Start pressure washer. Power wash stains and surrounding area using hot water. Using the wand, sweep detergent, debris, and water toward recovery pods. Check vacuum operation and effectiveness, reposition pods if necessary.
- Collect all wash water from cleaning operation.
- Leave site litter free with no puddles of standing water.
- Complete work-order and include recovery gallons.
- Discharge water at a Fleetwash approved dumpsite.

If an Inspector observes Fleetwash allowing wash water to flow to a storm drain, the Inspector requires the discharge to be stopped and immediately cleaned up. Inspectors will provide and review the required BMPs and the Fleetwash SOP with the discharger, and generally issue an NOV.

Description: Overall there were no major problems with the construction sites in 2013/2014. The most common issues for 2013/2014 were for sediment control (track out and potential runoff) and general site maintenance. There were more regulated projects in progress in 2013/2014 than in 2012/2013 and hence more inspections were conducted. It is expected that rates of new development and redevelopment will continue to increase each year as the economy recovers. The City will attempt to maintain a high level of scrutiny as the number of sites increases.

Description: The City of South San Francisco's program is strong, with frequent inspections performed at each construction site especially during the wet season. Inspectors inspect each construction site before the beginning of the wet season, prior to qualifying rain events and several times during an extended or severe storm. They follow up at each site after the storm to determine if any repairs are necessary. Most sites are very quick to respond and repair or replace their BMPs. Occasionally there are sites that require numerous inspections to illicit a response and repair their site BMPs. Inspectors try to work with these sites to bring them back into compliance. While it may occasionally take more than 10 business days, this leeway is only given when discharge from the site is not observed. Inspectors participate in erosion control training at least once every 2 years. Inspection and enforcement data is tabulated in a construction tracking spreadsheet, which underwent minor revision in 2013-2014. The program used inspection forms that were updated in February 2011.

The City of South San Francisco has installed 76 Connector Pipe Screen Full Trash Capture Devices treating a total of 463 acres in the City. Across all of the City's TMAs, these Full Trash Capture Devices treat 12% of low trash generating areas, 5% of medium trash generating areas and 2% of high trash generating areas. The City has no very high trash generating areas. The City is required to treat 58 acres per the MRP.

Descriptions of Maintenance Activities:

These Full Trash Capture devices are inspected/maintained on an average frequency of three times per year - before, during and after storm events. The main issue with the devices is that they plug up during storms causing flooding, therefore constant maintenance is required. Upon installation of the devices, the City had expected to only clean/maintain the devices before and after each storm. However, based on this flooding concern, it has been found that the devices require cleaning/maintenance during storms as well. Another issue with the devices is that the contractor is unavailable to help troubleshoot, as they have gone out of business. Maintenance records are on the Computerized Maintenance Management System (CMMS) located on the City server – Cityworks (maintenance records and reports) and are therefore easily accessed for audit purposes. The areas of treatment for each trash capture device are included in the City of South San Francisco's Long-term Trash Load Reduction Plan submitted on February 1, 2014.

In FY 13-14, the City of South San Francisco also participated in the initial development of a Model Trash Full Capture Device Operation and Maintenance (O&M)

Permittee Name: City of South San Francisco

Verification Program initiated by SMCWPPP. The model program is intended to provide Permittees with a template for documenting O&M procedures, including inspection and maintenance frequencies. Over the course of the next year, the City of South San Francisco plans to further document the city-specific O&M verification program by tailoring the Model Program developed by SMCWPPP to incorporate city-specific characteristics/processes. Discussion of Trash Reduction Estimate:

The preliminary trash load reduction estimates presented in this section provide the best available estimate of trash reduction from the City of South San Francisco's municipal separate stormwater sewer system (MS4). These estimates were developed consistent with the trash reduction framework developed in collaboration with Water Board staff in 2013-14, and the Pilot SMCWPPP Trash Assessment Strategy submitted to the Water Board in February 2014. All estimates are based on available information collected by the City of South San Francisco, should be considered preliminary at this time, and are subject to revision by Permittees based on additional information on the effectiveness of trash controls, the magnitude and extent of trash control measure implementation, and/or the levels of trash discharged from the City of South San Francisco's MS4.

Trash reduction estimates were based on initial data collection efforts that began in FY 13-14 and utilize the verified levels of baseline trash generation in the City of South San Francisco. Reductions associated with jurisdictional-wide trash control measures, trash full capture devices, other TMA-specific control measures, and trash cleanup events in local creeks and shorelines are included. Reductions associated with jurisdictional-wide actions are based on a combination of data collection and observations applicable to the City of South San Francisco. Reductions associated with trash full capture devices assume that trash generated in areas treated by effectively maintained devices reduce trash to a level of "no adverse impacts" to local water bodies. For control measures other than full capture devices, all reductions estimates are based on empirical observations of current trash levels (i.e., on-land visual assessments) and associated reductions in applicable trash management areas. Reductions associated with creek and shoreline cleanups are based on the amount of trash removed via these cleanups in FY 13-14, in comparison to baseline trash generation in the City of South San Francisco.

The City of SSF in partnership with San Mateo County Flood Control District/ Environmental Health, conducted an additional cleanup of the Colma Creek Hotspots for American Rivers Day on 5/17/14. Approximately 6 cubic feet of trash was collected. The focus of this cleanup was to reduce the amount of windblown pedestrian and vehicle litter entering the MS4 and to prevent illegally dumped materials to enter the creek. The major sources of trash collected were plastic food packaging and paper trash. Quarterly Colma Creek inspections attended by San Mateo County and City of San Francisco staff provide visual observations of the hotspots. The method for assessing the trash reduction for this additional cleanup involved dividing the amount of trash picked up during the event by the City's total estimated trash loading. Official assessments have not been performed; however observations by City and County staff (during quarterly inspections and general field work in the area) have indicated less visual trash impact in these hot spots.

The City of South San Francisco revised their Municipal Code to include a prohibition of discharge from copper architectural features. The revision was approved by City Council in January 2013. The specific language incorporated into the Municipal Code was included in section C.13.a.iii.(2) of the FY 12-13 Annual Stormwater Report.

Development of BMPs: The Countywide Program collaborated with BASMAA to develop BMPs to manage waste generated from cleaning and treating of copper architectural features, including copper roofs, during construction and post construction. These BMPs are distributed as needed.

Permitting Procedures to Require the BMPs: The Countywide Program updated its Stormwater Requirements Checklist to include the architectural copper BMPs in the list of source control measures that may apply to projects. The City of South San Francisco does not allow the discharge of wastewater from architectural copper to the storm drains.

Educate Installers and Operators: The Countywide Program, in collaboration with the Santa Clara Valley Urban Runoff Pollution Prevention Program, prepared an educational flyer on the BMPs. South San Francisco staff was trained on the BMPs by attending the construction site inspection training on April 23, 2013. Staff will use the revised Stormwater Requirements Checklist which includes source control for architectural copper features. Staff has made copper outreach materials available at the building department and will include them if relevant in materials distributed with plan check comments.

Enforcement Actions against Noncompliance: Staff will use the revised Stormwater Requirements Checklist which includes source control for architectural copper features. Staff will continue to make copper outreach materials available at the building department and will include them if relevant in materials distributed with plan check comments. There has been no enforcement action taken for noncompliance in this area. If noncompliance is observed or reported, the inspectors will investigate and proceed with enforcement action, if necessary, as stated in the City's Enforcement Response Plan.

Summary: **The City of South San Francisco participates in the Countywide Program's public outreach efforts and the Parks and Maintenance Committee. Additionally, New Development plan review comments for the City include the following:**

Landscaping shall meet the following conditions related to reduction of pesticide use on the project site:

- a. **Where feasible, landscaping shall be designed and operated to treat stormwater runoff by incorporating elements that collect, detain and infiltrate runoff. In areas that provide detention of water, plants that are tolerant of saturated soil conditions and prolonged exposure to water shall be specified.**
- b. **Plant materials selected shall be appropriate to site specific characteristics such as soil type, topography, climate, amount and timing of sunlight, prevailing winds, rainfall, air movement, patterns of land use, ecological consistency and plant interactions to ensure successful establishment.**
- c. **Existing native trees, shrubs and ground cover shall be retained and incorporated into the landscape plan to the maximum extent practicable.**

- d. Proper maintenance of landscaping, with minimal pesticide use, shall be the responsibility of the property owner.
- e. Integrated pest management (IPM) principles and techniques shall be encouraged as part of the landscaping design to the maximum extent practicable. Examples of IPM principles and techniques include:
 - i. Select plants that are well adapted to soil conditions at the site.
 - ii. Select plants that are well adapted to sun and shade conditions at the site. In making these selections, consider future conditions when plants reach maturity, as well as seasonal changes.
 - iii. Provide irrigation appropriate to the water requirements of the selected plants.
 - iv. Select pest-resistant and disease-resistant plants.
 - v. Plant a diversity of species to prevent a potential pest infestation from affecting the entire landscaping plan.
 - vi. Use “insectary” plants in the landscaping to attract and keep beneficial insects.

The Inspectors will notify business owners if ongoing, large volume landscape irrigation runoff is observed and require the curtailment of the runoff.

Additionally, the City uses the revised New Development Checklist that includes landscaping site design measures and source control.

BACKGROUND

This industrial and commercial business inspection plan (Inspection Plan) serves as the city's prioritized inspection work plan that the city will implement to comply with the municipal regional stormwater permit's (MRP) Provision C.4.b requirements. This MRP provision requires that an Inspection Plan be developed. The Inspection Plan's attached Prioritized Inspection List of Businesses (Inspection List) must be submitted with the 2010 Annual Report, and an annually updated Inspection List must be submitted with subsequent annual reports.

Municipal staff used the following steps to create this Inspection Plan and comply with the MRP. Steps 1 and 2 address MRP requirements for the Inspection Plan and Step 3 addresses compliance with MRP requirements for creating an Inspection List that is included as an attachment to the Inspection Plan.

Steps

1. Identify a method of establishing priorities for inspections and the frequency of inspections for each category of priority.
2. Describe the method that will be used to identify newly opened businesses that may need inspection.
3. Develop an Inspection List that includes:
 - a. A list of all of the industrial and commercial businesses located within the municipality's jurisdiction that require inspection;
 - b. A determination of the priority for inspection of each business on the Inspection List using the identified method of establishing inspection priorities;
 - c. Identification of businesses on the Inspection List that are scheduled for inspection during the current fiscal year; and
 - d. An annual update or revision of the Inspection List starting in 2011.

Each of these steps was followed to develop this Inspection Plan as described in the following sections.

STEP 1: IDENTIFY A METHOD OF ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR INSPECTIONS AND FREQUENCY OF INSPECTIONS

What the MRP Requires

The MRP requires that each of the businesses to be inspected be assigned a priority for inspection based on "the potential for water quality impact using criteria such as pollutant sources on site, pollutants of concern, proximity to a waterbody, violation history of the facility, and other relevant factors" (Provision C.4.b.ii.(3)). In addition, the MRP requires that appropriate inspection frequencies be established based on the priority for inspection, "potential for contributing pollution to stormwater runoff" and be "commensurate with the threat to water quality" (Provision C.4.b.ii.(5)).

Further, the MRP requires: "A description of the process for prioritizing inspections and frequency of inspections" (Provision C.4.b.i.(2)).

Description of Prioritization Process and Assignment of Inspection Frequencies to Different Priorities

- Businesses meeting the following criteria generally have been assigned as having a high priority for inspection:
1. Businesses that are subject to the State General NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity.
 2. Businesses that have a history of using inadequate best management practices.
 3. Businesses that have had a non-stormwater discharge disallowed by the MRP during the previous fiscal year.
 4. Food service facilities and vehicle mechanical repair that are due for re-inspection and/or re-permitting with wastewater permits.

All other businesses have generally been assigned as having a low priority for inspection.

1. High priority for inspection means that the business will typically be inspected annually. Low priority for inspection means that the business will be inspected less frequently than annually, such as every other year or every third year. Businesses that have a non-stormwater discharge during any fiscal year will be moved to the high priority category and then inspected during the next fiscal year.
2. Food service facilities on the low priority inspection will be inspected upon renewal of their wastewater discharge permit.
3. Auto facilities on the low priority will be inspected at least twice per permit cycle.

STEP 2: DESCRIBE METHOD THAT WILL BE USED TO IDENTIFY NEW BUSINESSES

What the MRP Requires

The MRP requires that the Inspection Plan have a "mechanism to include newly opened businesses that warrant inspection ..." (Provision C.4.b.i.(2)).

Description of Method for Identifying New Businesses

The City of South San Francisco will identify new businesses that warrant inspection through the business license sign off process. New businesses require a sign off from the Environmental Compliance department. At that time, should the business warrant inspection, it will be inspected before the business license is signed off. The business will be added to the inspection spreadsheet and prioritized at the time of addition. If the business is deemed to not have an impact on the stormwater system it will be omitted from the list.

STEP 3: DEVELOP AN INSPECTION LIST

This step includes the following four substeps associated with the development and maintenance of the Inspection List:

- a. Develop a list of all of the industrial and commercial businesses that require inspection;
- b. Determine the priority for inspection of each business on the Inspection List;

- c. Identify businesses on the Inspection List that are scheduled for inspection during the current fiscal year; and
- d. Prepare an annual update or revision of the Inspection List starting in 2011.

What the MRP Requires

Develop a List of All Businesses Requiring Inspection

The MRP requires that the Inspection Plan be used to maintain an Inspection List of industrial and commercial businesses “that could reasonably be considered to cause or contribute to pollution of stormwater runoff” (Provision C.4.b.ii).

In particular, the MRP lists the following types of businesses as needing to be inspected if they “have a reasonable likelihood to be sources of pollutants to stormwater and non-stormwater discharges:” (Provision C.4.b.ii(2))

- 1) Industrial facilities¹, as defined in 40 CFR 122.26(b)(14), including those subject to the State General NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity;
- 2) Vehicle salvage yards;
- 3) Metal and other recycled material collection facilities, waste transfer facilities;
- 4) Vehicle mechanical repair, maintenance, fueling, or cleaning;
- 5) Building trades central facilities or yards, corporation yards, nurseries, and greenhouses;
- 6) Building material retailers and storage;
- 7) Plastic manufacturers; and
- 8) Other facilities designated by the City or Water Board as having a reasonable potential to contribute to pollution of stormwater runoff. The Water Board staff places a priority on inspecting retail food facilities, and these businesses should be included in the Inspection List if they “have a reasonable likelihood to be sources of pollutants to stormwater and non-stormwater discharges.”

In addition, the MRP lists the following functional aspects of businesses that may produce pollutants when exposed to stormwater as part of the criteria for developing the Inspection List:

- 1) Outdoor process and manufacturing areas;
- 2) Outdoor material storage areas;
- 3) Outdoor waste storage and disposal areas;
- 4) Outdoor vehicle and equipment storage and maintenance areas;
- 5) Outdoor wash areas;
- 6) Outdoor drainage from indoor areas;
- 7) Rooftop equipment; and
- 8) Other sources determined by the city or Water Board to have a reasonable potential to contribute to pollution of stormwater runoff.

Establish Inspection Priority for Businesses on the Inspection List

The MRP requires that businesses that have a reasonable potential to pollute stormwater runoff be prioritized using factors listed in the MRP (Provision C.4.b.ii.(3)).

Identify Businesses Scheduled for Inspection During the Current Fiscal Year

¹ The MRP appears to use the terms “facilities” and “businesses” interchangeably. This template generally uses the term business since that is used in the title of Provision C.4.b., and it is the term most inspectors use.

The MRP requires that the annual report include “the list of facilities scheduled for inspection during the current fiscal year” (Provision C.4.b.iii.(2)).

Annual Updates

The MRP requires that the Inspection List be annually updated and maintained (Provision C.4.b.ii). The annual updates should include new businesses; any needed modifications to inspection priorities based on recent inspections, illicit discharge notifications, or other relevant factors; and removal of businesses that are no longer operating. In addition, updates or revisions to the Inspection List need to be included in annual reports starting in 2011 (Provision C.4.b.iii.(1)).

Substep 3a: Develop Inspection List

Substep 3b: Determine Priority for Businesses

Businesses meeting the following criteria generally have been assigned as having a high priority for inspection:

1. Businesses that are subject to the State General NPDES Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity.
2. Businesses that have a history of using inadequate best management practices.
3. Businesses that have had a non-stormwater discharge disallowed by the MRP (illicit discharge) during the previous fiscal year.
4. Food service facilities and vehicle mechanical repair that are due for re-inspection and/or re-permitting with wastewater permits.







**San Mateo Countywide Water Pollution Prevention Program
Model Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Policy
for the City of South San Francisco**

GOAL

The *City of South San Francisco* seeks to protect the health and safety of its employees and the general public, the environment and water quality, as well as to provide sustainable solutions for pest control through the reduced use of pesticides on property including buildings owned or managed by the City by applying Integrated Pesticide Management principles and techniques. The municipal regional stormwater permit requires that the *City of South San Francisco* minimize reliance on pesticides that threaten water quality.

REQUIRED USE OF INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT

Employees implementing pest management controls will use Integrated Pest Management (IPM) techniques that emphasize non-pesticide alternatives. Pesticides will only be used after careful consideration of non-chemical alternatives and then the least toxic chemicals that are effective shall be used. Pest control contractors hired by the City are required to implement IPM to control pests. This will be achieved by hiring only IPM-certified pest control contractors or by including contract specifications requiring contractors to implement IPM methods.

The City will establish written standard operating procedures for pesticide use to ensure implementation of this IPM policy and to require municipal employees and pest control contractors to comply with the standard operating procedures.

The *City of South San Francisco* will track employee and contractor pesticide use and prepare an annual report summarizing pesticide use and evaluating pest control activities performed consistent with the municipal regional stormwater permit's requirements.

The *City of South San Francisco* will review its purchasing procedures, contracts or service agreements with pest control contractors and employee training practices to determine what changes, if any, need to be made to support the implementation of this IPM Policy.

The *City of South San Francisco* will perform educational outreach and/or support Countywide or regional efforts to educate residential and commercial pesticide users on a) goals and techniques of IPM, and b) pesticide related water quality issues consistent with the municipal regional stormwater permit's requirements.

The IPM-based hierarchical decision making process that will be used to control pests will include the following:

1. Based on field observations evaluate locations and sites where pest problems commonly occur to determine pest population, size, occurrence, and natural enemy population, if

- present. Identify conditions that contribute to the development of pest populations, and decisions and practices that could be employed to manage pest populations
2. Design, construct, and maintain landscapes and buildings to reduce and eliminate pest habitats;
 3. Modify management practices including watering, mulching, waste management, and food storage to discourage the development of pest population;
 4. Modify pest ecosystems to reduce food, water sources, and harborage;
 5. Prioritize the use of physical controls such as mowing weeds, using traps, and installing barriers;
 6. Use biological controls to introduce or enhance a pests' natural enemies;
 7. When pest populations reach treatment thresholds (based on how much biological, aesthetic, economic or other damage is tolerable) non-pesticide management activities will be evaluated before considering the use of pesticides;
 8. When pesticides are necessary, select reduced risk pesticides and use the minimum amounts needed to be effective;
 9. Apply pesticides at the most effective treatment time, based on pest biology, monitoring, and other variables, such as weather, seasonal changes in wildlife use, and local conditions; and
 10. Whenever possible, use pesticide application methods, such as containerized baits, that minimize opportunities for mobilization of the pesticide in stormwater runoff.

Departments performing pest management activities will identify an IPM coordinator who is responsible for assisting staff with implementation of this IPM policy.

BACKGROUND

Pesticides are defined as: any substance or mixture of substances intended for preventing, destroying, repelling, or mitigating any pest. Pests can be insects, rodents and other animals, unwanted plants (weeds), bacteria or fungi. The term pesticide applies to herbicides, fungicides, insecticides, rodenticides, molluscicides and other substances used to control pests.

Integrated Pest Management (IPM) is an ecosystem-based strategy that focuses on long-term prevention of pests or their damage through a combination of techniques such as biological control, habitat manipulation, modification of cultural practices, and use of resistant varieties. Pesticides are used only after monitoring indicates they are needed according to established guidelines, and treatments are made with the goal of removing only the target organism. Pest control materials are selected and applied in a manner that minimizes risks to human health, beneficial and nontarget organisms, and the environment.

IPM techniques could include biological controls (e.g., ladybugs and other natural enemies or predators); physical or mechanical controls (e.g., hand labor or mowing, caulking entry points to buildings); cultural controls (e.g., mulching, alternative plant type selection, and enhanced cleaning and containment of food sources in buildings); and reduced risk chemical controls (e.g., soaps or oils).

City of South San Francisco owned or managed property/facility includes but is not limited to parks and open space, golf courses, roadsides, landscaped medians, flood control channels and other outdoor areas, as well as municipal buildings and structures.

City of South San Francisco
Standard Operating Procedures for Pesticide Use and Implementation
of the Municipality's Integrated pest Management Policy

Purpose: To minimize the use and reliance on pesticides that threaten water quality by implementing the City's policy for integrated pest management (IPM) by all municipal employees and contractor's hired to manage pests on municipal property.

Responsible Parties: All City personnel that as part of their municipal job duties are authorized to plan, manage, and control pests including pesticide applications and all City personnel that administer municipal contracts for applying pesticide on municipal property.

Contracts & Contractors: Contracts shall include a requirement that the contractor shall adhere to the City's IPM policy. This will be accomplished by using the following procedures:

1. Include a copy of the municipality's IPM policy in the contractor solicitation documents e.g., Request for Proposal or Request for Quote, and make it clear that the pest control services being solicited must comply with IPM policy.
2. Include a copy of the municipality's IPM policy in the contract's specification.
3. Meet with the contractor to review the City's IPM policy.

Municipal Employee's: Municipal employees who are authorized to manage pests are required to implement the City's IPM policy. This will be accomplished by using the following procedures:

1. Use cultural practices and pest prevention measures to minimize the occurrence of pest problems.
2. Set a threshold of tolerance for pests.
3. Use biological and physical controls that are environmentally appropriate and economically feasible to control pests.
4. Use chemical control as a last resort, and then the least toxic product will be used. Where feasible for structural pest control, insecticides will be applied as containerized baits.
5. Avoid the use of pesticides that threaten water quality especially in formulations and situations that pose a risk of contaminating stormwater runoff.
6. Train employees on IPM techniques, pesticides-related stormwater pollution prevention methods, the municipality's IPM policy, and these standard operating procedures.
7. As part of the municipality's annual report for the municipal regional stormwater permit, report on the IPM policy's implementation by showing trends in the quantities and types of pesticides used and suggest reasons for any increases in uses of pesticides that threaten water quality.

SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Services Agreement (this "Agreement") is made and entered into between the City of South San Francisco, a municipal corporation ("City") and Western Exterminator, ("Contractor") effective as of June 15, 2012 (the "Effective Date"). City and Contractor are hereinafter collectively referred to as (the "Parties"). In consideration of their mutual covenants, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Scope of Work. Contractor shall provide the following services and/or materials ("the Work"): **on as needed basis to perform pest control service on city buildings; such as cockroaches, rats, mice, ants, rodents and others.** The Work shall commence on **June 18, 2012 to June 30, 2013.** and work shall be completed to the satisfaction of the City. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between the text of the main body of this Agreement and Exhibit A, the text of the main body of this Agreement shall prevail.

2. Payment. City shall pay Contractor an amount not to exceed: **Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000)** for the full and satisfactory completion of the Work in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The method of payment for the Work shall be set forth as follows: **on as needed basis to perform pest control service on City Buildings.** The amount stated above is the entire compensation payable to Contractor for the Work performed hereunder, including all labor, materials, tools and equipment furnished by Contractor.

3. Independent Contractor. It is understood and agreed that this Agreement is not a contract of employment and does not create an employer-employee relationship between the City and Contractor. At all times Contractor shall be an independent contractor and Contractor is not authorized to bind the City to any contracts or other obligations without the express written consent of the City.

4. Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, Contractor shall indemnify, defend (with counsel acceptable to the City), and hold harmless the City and its elected and appointed officers, officials, employees, agents, contractors and consultants (collectively, the "City Indemnitees") from and against any and all liability, loss, damage, claims, expenses and costs (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees and costs of litigation) (collectively, "Liability") of every nature arising out of or in connection with Contractor's performance of the Work or Contractor's failure to comply with this Agreement, except such Liability caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the City Indemnitees.

5. Insurance. Prior to beginning the Work and continuing throughout the term of this Agreement, Contractor (and any subcontractors) shall, at Contractor's (or subcontractor's) sole cost and expense, furnish the City with certificates of insurance evidencing that Contractor has obtained and maintains insurance in the following amounts:

A. Workers' Compensation that satisfies the minimum statutory limits.

B. Commercial General Liability and Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per occurrence, TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000) annual aggregate, for bodily injury, property damage, products, completed operations and contractual liability coverage. The policy shall also include coverage for liability arising out of the use and operation of any City-owned or City-furnished equipment used or operated by the Contractor, its personnel, agents or subcontractors.

C. Comprehensive automobile insurance in an amount not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage including coverage for owned and non-owned vehicles.

All insurance policies shall be written on an occurrence basis and shall name the City Indemnitees as additional insureds. The certificates shall contain a statement of obligation on the part of the carrier to notify City of any material change, cancellation, termination or non-renewal of the coverage at least thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date of any such material change, cancellation, termination or non-renewal. The City's Risk Manager may waive or modify any of the insurance requirements of this section.

6. Compliance with all Applicable Laws; Nondiscrimination. Contractor shall comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations and ordinances in the performance of this Agreement. Contractor shall not discriminate in the provision of service or in the employment of persons engaged in the performance of this Agreement on account of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, gender, marital status, sexual orientation, age, physical or mental disability in violation of any applicable local, state or federal laws or regulations.

7. Integrated Pest Management. Attached to this Agreement as **Exhibit B**, and incorporated herein, is the City's current adopted Integrated Pest Management ("IPM") Policy. Contractor hereby acknowledges receipt of the City's IPM Policy. Further, Contractor shall comply with the City's IPM Policy when performing Work under this Agreement.


8. Termination. City may terminate or suspend this Agreement at any time and without cause upon written notification to Contractor. Upon receipt of notice of termination or suspension, Contractor shall immediately stop all work in progress under this Agreement. The City's right of termination shall be in addition to all other remedies available under law to the City.





Narrative Discussion of LID Feasibility or Infeasibility

Narrative Discussion of LID Feasibility or Infeasibility

Reporting period- January 1- June 30, 2014

The 889 McLellan Rd. project was given discretionary approval in March of 2011 when it was approved by the South San Francisco City Council. After final approval the project was placed on hold due to economic conditions. The project was dormant until December 2013, when the project developer contacted the Cities Environmental Compliance Program about submittal of building plans. At this time the discussion of Stormwater LID for this project started and has continued since they submitted building plans to the City.

889 McLellan Rd. may be using the special project credits depending upon the availability to use multiple small area of landscaping for flow through planters and bioretention. This is a potential project and using special project credits may not be necessary for Stormwater treatment. Currently the project is in the building plan submittal phase. It will be held here until all Stormwater regulations meet current standard and are approved by the Control Authority. Currently the Environmental Compliance Program is working with the project Planners, Developers and Engineers to see that the regulations are met. As of now the project looks like it will be able to capture and treat its entire run off and treat it through bioretention and flow through planters. The FAR is still to be determined depending upon the site features.

1. Feasibility/Infeasibility of Onsite Infiltration, Evapotranspiration, and Harvesting/Use

The Countywide Program's infiltration/harvesting and use feasibility screening worksheet and rainwater harvesting and use worksheet was completed for the project. The results of this analysis showed that it was infeasible to treat the C.3.d amount of runoff with infiltration and/or harvesting and reuse. This project is adjacent to the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) South San Francisco Station and consequently the BART tube is underground just west of the site. These conditions will not allow for infiltration as it may have a potential to cause problems with the BART tube. There is not enough for demand rainwater harvesting/reuse for this project, giving it the infeasible status.

2. Feasibility/Infeasibility of Onsite LID Treatment

The project site was reviewed with regard to the feasibility/infeasibility of onsite LID treatment. The results of this review showed that it is infeasible to treat the entire C.3.d amount of runoff with harvesting/use or Bioinfiltration LID treatment measures. This project will be using LID Biotreatment measures via flow-through planters and bioretention areas. The findings of this review are presented below.

- a. **On-site Drainage Conditions.** The site drainage is gravity from the roof and courtyard area, including the site slope from the roof is steep, the direction of flow is in all directions, and the site was divided into drainage management areas that drain into a total of 11 separate stormwater treatment measures areas.
- b. **Self-treating and Self-Retaining Areas and LID Treatment Measures.** The area has 11 different LID biotreatment areas and are either: flow through planters or bioretention.
- c. **Maximizing Flow to LID Features and Facilities.** Drainage to LID treatment is via gravity to bioretention and flow through planters that double as landscape features around the perimeter of the site.
- d. **Constraints to Providing On-site LID.** Tentatively the design will allow Full LID treatment onsite or on an easement on the south side of the project. The areas not covered by buildings are a drive isle to the underground parking area or are landscaping.
 - i. Impervious paved areas: There are no pervious paved areas.
 - ii. Landscaped areas: All landscaped areas on site are tentatively used for LID treatment.

3. **Feasibility/Infeasibility of Off-Site LID Treatment.** The project does not need off-site treatment.

4. **Current Status:** This project has been sent back to the developer and is on hold and has will be until plans are resubmitted to the building department.
