Enclosed is the 2015-16 Annual Report for the City of Concord, which is required by and in accordance with Provision C.17 in National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Number CAS612008 issued by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board.

In accordance with Provision C.17.c, the City of Concord is disclosing that it was not in compliance with Provision C.10.c.iii, Trash Hot Spot Assessment. Due to staffing issues, the City did not conduct the necessary assessment (photo-documentation, trash volume estimation, and trash source identification) this fiscal year. The City has since completed the assessment on September 12, 2016 for the FY15-16 reporting year as reflected in the enclosed Annual Report. The City understands that this assessment is deemed to fulfill the requirement for the FY15-16 reporting year and a separate assessment will be completed prior to the FY16-17 reporting deadline of June 30, 2017.

I certify under penalty of law that this document and all attachments were prepared under my direction or supervision in accordance with a system designed to assure that qualified personnel properly gathered and evaluated the information submitted. Based on my inquiry of the person or persons who manage the system, or those persons directly responsible for gathering the information, the information submitted is, to the best of my knowledge and belief, true, accurate, and complete. I am aware that there are significant penalties for submitting false information, including the possibility of fines and imprisonment for knowing violations.

Summary:

- (1) Municipality’s legal authority to implement C.3:** The City regulates projects subject to Provision C.3 of the MRP through the City’s Stormwater Management and Discharge Control Ordinance (Chapter 16.05 of the Concord Municipal Code).
- (2) Municipality’s development review and permitting procedures, including use of conditions of approval or other enforceable mechanisms:** All projects submitted to the City are reviewed by the Engineering Division for compliance with Provision C.3. Engineering staff reviews projects during the planning stages (i.e., tentative map, use permit, design review) and has standard conditions of approval that the project shall comply with Provision C.3 prior to issuance of a grading permit. In addition, projects that do not go through planning (i.e., building permits) are reviewed by Engineering staff and require compliance with Provision C.3 prior to permit issuance.
- (3) How water quality effects and mitigation measures are addressed in environmental reviews (e.g., CEQA):** For large projects that require an extensive CEQA review, Engineering reviews the project and provides comments with respect to water quality effects.
- (4) C.3 training for appropriate departments:** Staff training is primarily provided through the CCCWP. This past FY, five engineering staff members (2 Development, 3 Capital Improvement) attended the CCCWP’s C.3 Workshop on June 7, 2016. Engineering staff meet with Planning staff to discuss C.3 requirements for projects as they are submitted. The City also participates in both the CCCWP Development Committee and BASMAA Development Committee.
- (5) Outreach/education efforts to staff, developers, contractors, construction site operators and owner/builders:** Staff provides outreach to developers, contractors, construction site operators and owner/builders during Pre-Application meetings and during the plan review process.
- (6) How your municipality encourages site design measures at unregulated projects subject to Planning/Building Department review:** Staff encourages projects that are not required to implement C.3 by providing comments to plans prior to permit issuance about possible LID measures.
- (7) City staff encourages incorporation of source control measures at unregulated projects during the Planning/Building Department review process.** For example, tenant improvement projects which propose exterior site work are directed to divert impervious area runoff to adjacent landscape and, where appropriate, to install full trash capture devices in parking lot inlets.

**The Contra Costa Clean Water Program adopted a December 1, 2012 addendum to the Stormwater C.3 Guidebook, 6th Edition. The addendum, “Preparing a Stormwater Control Plan for a Small Land Development Project,” includes step-by-step instructions, a project data form, and standard specifications for runoff reduction measures. The City of Concord’s stormwater ordinance requires that applications for development approvals for projects subject to the permit’s new development requirements include a Stormwater Control Plan meeting the criteria in the most recent version of the Stormwater C.3 Guidebook.**

**Concord Public Works (PW) staff, in their daily activities of maintaining the stormwater system, look for sources or evidence of illicit discharge. These are identified by unusual color, cloudiness, or odor or telltale marks, or discoloration on pavement or storm drain facilities. Illicit discharge is also identified as discharge during dry weather when there should be no discharge to the drainage system. Trash capture devices are cleaned two times per year. Storm drain inlets were inspected and cleaned if needed, in addition to two miles of V-ditches and open channels, and six miles of roadside ditches and watercourses including: inlets, culverts, and a trash rack. Any problems were corrected immediately. City staff also investigates complaints/observations called in by residents.**

**The City of Concord’s illicit discharge complaint and response program is implemented as follows: public calls and staff encounters are documented on a call out work order as soon as the information is received. Staff evaluates availability and either dispatches City staff or contacts an on call contractor (Concord Disposal).**

**Of the 608 illicit discharge or dumping complaints received by PW, the vast majority was dumping of trash and furniture items in the public ROW. The major type of complaint was the dumping of furniture and mattresses with 335 events. The next significant category continues to be trash with 146 followed by appliances and metal complaints with 91 events. Automotive had 21 events, yard waste had 7 events, construction materials had 5 events and hazardous wastes reported was 3 events, all contained. For this past FY, Concord PW received no complaints that were unsubstantiated in the field; PW staff received no reports of spills.**

**Occasionally, Concord’s Code Enforcement staff receive and investigate complaints of illicit discharges. This past FY, five calls reporting potential illicit discharges were received and investigated; one complaint of rainfall runoff onto adjacent property and four complaints of discharges that were determined to be unfounded.**

**Lastly, the City of Concord has issued a violation to the owner of the Exxon station located at 2380 Willow Pass Road for completion of improvements in violation of the City’s Stormwater Management and Discharge Control Ordinance and the C.3 provisions of the MRP. (See comments in Section C.3.b.iv.(2) Reporting Table.) Until treatment devices for the created and replaced impervious surfaces are constructed, the City views all stormwater exiting this site as an illicit discharge. This accounts for the one discharge reaching the storm drain and one discharge not resolved in a timely manner noted above.**

This past FY, Concord's Construction Inspection Supervisor provided an internal training to inspection staff during a Staff Meeting. Additionally, 100% of Concord's Construction Inspectors attended the Construction Site Controls Workshop hosted by the CCCWP.

Local Outreach efforts include:

- The City has 261 banners mounted to streetlight poles throughout the City, mostly on major thoroughfares (e.g. Monument Boulevard, Port Chicago Highway, Clayton Road, Concord Avenue, Ayres Road, Pine Hollow Road, Willow Pass Road, Galindo Street). The banners educate the public through messages such as “Keep Concord Beautiful” by recycling motor oil and not littering. In April 2016, staff replaced 100 seasonal banners with a brand new design that promotes used motor oil recycling. New this year, the City has a map showing the locations of the banners: <https://drive.google.com/open?id=1xvzwvAmUOigWjCiaoQlV0C7safU&usp=sharing>
- The City ran Public Service advertisements throughout the 2015-16 Fiscal Year providing information on a variety of Cleanwater topics such as street sweeping schedule location, illegal dumping hotline, Used Household battery recycling information, reminders to recycle used motor oil, not to flush pharmaceutical products down the toilet, not to rake leaves into the street, etc. The messages ran on Concord's Community Bulletin Board on Concord TV Cable Channel 24 and 25 (AT&T Broadband) and Channel 29 (Seren & Astound!/Wave). Each of these messages ran on TV from two months to six months during the year – average about four months. Additionally, whenever there is no other programming scheduled, the messages cycle through. Each message is screened for 14 seconds at a time.

**The City of Concord has many business types that are considered potential users of copper including: body shops, car wash/detail, fleet operations, machine shops, pools, recycling centers and vehicle service businesses.**  
**When inspecting these types of businesses for Concord, CCCSD is always addressing BMPs such as how they store their metals recycling, ensuring that they are not washing or discharging to storm.**

Summaries of WNs and NOV's issued this past FY for businesses that may have contained copper include the following:

- An NOV was issued to Costco for a stated practice of discharging their tire test tank water outside to the parking lot. They stated that they will no longer discharge to storm.
- An NOV was issued to Autocom Nissan of Concord for oil and brake lathe grindings spilled inside and migrating outside into storm drain system. These were cleaned up and a follow-up inspection found no further issues.
- An NOV was issued to Contra Costa Carburetor for oily car parts stored outside and mop water being discharged to the storm drain. All violations were found to be abated at follow-up inspection.
- An NOV issued to Latinos' Tire and Auto Service for a transmission leaking to the parking lot pavement. Dry absorbent was used to clean leaked material.

- **Green Business Program, which promotes to businesses a variety of measures such as using drought tolerant plantings, mulching, carefully monitoring irrigation schedules and needs, and implementing Integrated Pest Management.**
- **Our Water Our World (OWOW) Program, which promotes to consumers at the point of purchase less toxic alternatives to combating lawn and garden pests.**
- **Bay Friendly Landscaping and Gardening Training and Certification Program, which promotes to landscapers a variety of measures designed to reduce waste and prevent stormwater pollution.**

## New Development / C.3

Provision C.3 in the Municipal Regional Permit (MRP) requires site designs for new developments and redevelopments to minimize the area of new roofs and paving. Where feasible, pervious surfaces should be used instead of paving so that runoff can infiltrate to the underlying soil. Remaining runoff from impervious areas must be captured and used or treated using bioretention. In some developments, the rates and durations of site runoff must also be controlled.

In addition, project applicants must execute agreements to allow municipalities to verify that stormwater treatment and flow-control facilities are maintained in perpetuity.

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board for the San Francisco Bay Region adopted a re-issued MRP in November 2015.

The C.3 requirements are separate from, and in addition to, requirements for erosion and sediment control and for pollution prevention measures during construction.


