

Justification

Information Supporting Selection as a Hot Spot (Attach additional photos as necessary):

The City of San Leandro has approximately 5 miles of shoreline along the eastern shore of San Francisco Bay. In addition, San Leandro Creek, which originates and terminates in Oakland, runs through northern San Leandro. City staff visually inspected and assessed the bay shoreline and accessible portions of San Leandro Creek using the attached Alameda County Clean Water Program Hot Spot Field Screening Worksheet. Based on the five criteria, the City selected the four areas that ranked highest on the list.

The San Leandro Parcourse is located along San Francisco Bay adjacent to the City's largest park, Marina Park. The site is easily accessible to the public and sees significant pedestrian usage. Much of the litter found is windblown across the bay and is transportable, buoyant and persistent. Some of the litter is from the park, which has large and numerous picnic areas and is used by hundreds of people during the weekends. The pedestrian traffic also contributes to the litter with cups, food wrappers and cigarette litter.
