
Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements
for
Specific Facilities

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (hereinafter Board), finds that:

1. The Orders listed in Attachment "A" were issued by the Board at various times for the facilities described therein. Attachment "A" is hereby made a part of this Order. Waste discharge requirements for the facilities listed in Attachment "A" are no longer necessary because discharges were never initiated or have ceased, or discharge requirements are waived pursuant to Resolution No. R8-2007-0036.
2. This action is based on the fact that specific discharges were not initiated or have ceased, or that discharge requirements are waived pursuant to a duly adopted waste discharge requirement waiver resolution. As such, this action is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3), Chapter 3, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.
3. The Board has notified the dischargers and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind the Orders for the facilities listed in Attachment "A" and have provided them with an opportunity to submit written comments and recommendations.
4. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of waste discharge requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Orders listed in Attachment "A" be rescinded.
