Order No. R8-2009-0029

Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements
for
Specific Facilities

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (hereinafter Board), finds that:

1. The Orders listed in Attachment "A" were issued by the Board at various times for the facilities described therein. Attachment "A" is hereby made a part of this Order. Waste discharge requirements for the facilities listed in Attachment "A" are no longer necessary because the facility discharge has ceased or has been sewerred, the facility is covered under an applicable Regional Board general permit, the construction activities have been completed or the dredging project has been completed. In one case, waste discharge requirements are being rescinded because the discharger has failed to pay annual permit fees. Discharges from the facility are prohibited unless appropriate regulatory authorization is obtained.
2. This action is based on the fact that specific discharges were not initiated or have ceased, or that discharge requirements are waived pursuant to a duly adopted waste discharge requirement waiver resolution. As such, this action is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act in accordance with Section 15061(b)(3), Chapter 3, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.
3. The Board has notified the dischargers and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind the Orders for the facilities listed in Attachment "A" and have provided them with an opportunity to submit written comments and recommendations.
4. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of waste discharge requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Orders listed in Attachment "A" be rescinded.

SUBJECT: Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. R8-2009-0029

DISCUSSION:

Waste discharge requirements for the facilities/entities listed in Attachment "A" of Order No. R8-2009-0029 are no longer necessary because discharges from the facility have ceased or have been sewered, the facility is covered under an applicable Regional Board general permit, or the dredging project or construction activities have been completed. In one case, coverage under waste discharge requirements is being rescinded due to non-payment of annual permit fees. Discharges from the facility to waters of the State are prohibited unless appropriate regulatory authorization is obtained.

Adopt Order No. R8-2009-0029, as presented.
