Dear Mr. Tovar:

Enclosed is a certified copy of Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R8-2009-0051 (hereinafter "Complaint"). The Complaint alleges that Cast Industries Corporation has violated California Water Code Section 13399.30(a)(2) and the State's General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity, Order No. 97-03-DWQ, NPDES No. CAS000001 (hereinafter "General Permit") by failing to obtain coverage under the General Permit to discharge storm water associated with industrial activity. The Complaint proposes that administrative civil liability in the amount of six thousand four hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$6,485) be imposed as authorized by Water Code Sections 13399.33(a)(1) and 13399.33(d). In addition to the Complaint, we are enclosing a Waiver Form and Hearing Procedure that sets forth important requirements and deadlines for participation in the hearing. 



Pursuant to California Water Code Section 13323, Cast Industries Corporation has the option to waive its right to a hearing. YOU ARE HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

1. Cast Industries Corporation is alleged to have violated California Water Code (hereinafter "CWC") Section 13399.30(a)(2) and the State's General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity, Order No. 97-03-DWQ, NPDES No. CAS000001 (General Permit) by failing to obtain coverage under the General Permit to discharge storm water associated with industrial activity for which the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (hereinafter "Regional Board"), must impose liability under CWC Section 13399.33.
2. A hearing concerning this Complaint will be held before the Regional Board within 90 days of the date of issuance of this Complaint, unless, pursuant to CWC Section 13323, Cast Industries Corporation waives its right to a hearing. The hearing in this matter is scheduled for the Regional Board's regular meeting on December 10, 2009, at the City Council Chambers, City of Corona, 400 S. Vicentia Avenue, City of Corona, California. Cast Industries Corporation or its representative will have an opportunity to appear and be heard, and to contest the allegations in this Complaint and the imposition of civil liability by the Regional Board.
3. If a hearing is held on this matter, the Regional Board will consider whether to affirm, reject, or modify the proposed administrative civil liability or whether to refer the matter to the Attorney General for recovery of judicial civil liability. If this matter proceeds to hearing, the Prosecution Team reserves the right to seek an increase in the civil liability amount to cover the costs of enforcement incurred subsequent to the issuance of this Complaint through hearing. The enforcement costs may be recovered pursuant to CWC Section 13399.33(d).

THIS COMPLAINT IS BASED ON THE FOLLOWING FACTS:

4. Most industrial facilities that discharge storm water associated with industrial activities are required to obtain coverage under the General Permit. The facilities

that are required to get permit coverage are listed by industrial category and by Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) codes in 40 CFR Section 122.26(b)(14) and in Attachment 1 of the General Permit.

5. Cast Industries Corporation is a steel and other ferrous and non-ferrous metals investment casting (hereinafter "investment casting") industry located at 1755 Placentia Ave., Costa Mesa, California (hereinafter "site"). Investment casting activities are described by SIC code 3324. Thus, coverage under the general permit is mandatory for investment casting activities and must be obtained prior to the start of operations.
6. The Cast Industries Corporation site was covered under the General Permit from May 20, 2005 through July 16, 2007. During that permitted period, the Cast Industries Corporation site was owned and/or operated by Art Urquiza/Jerry Miller (hereinafter "Previous Owner/Operator").
7. Regional Board staff (hereinafter "Staff") conducted an inspection of the site on July 6, 2007 and determined that industrial operations at the site had ceased. On July 16, 2007, Staff administratively terminated General Permit coverage for the site under the Previous Owner/Operator's WDID 8 30I019531.
8. In March 2009, Staff was informed that operations at the facility had been restarted under new ownership and had been operating for several months. The new Owner/Operator of the site is Christopher Tovar.
9. Pursuant to the notice requirements set forth in CWC Section 13399.30, Staff issued a Notice of Non-Compliance (NNC) on April 9, 2009, via certified mail addressed to Cast Industries Corporation requiring it to submit a Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under the General Permit. The return receipt showed that the NNC was received by Rosen Peralta at the site on April 13, 2009. When Staff received no response from Cast Industries Corporation within 30 days of the first NNC, a second NNC was issued on May 14, 2009 by certified mail addressed to Cast Industries Corporation. The return receipt showed that the second NNC was also received Rosen Peralta at the site on May 15, 2009. In both NNCs, Staff requested submittal of a NOI for coverage under the General Permit, and identified Cast Industries Corporation's potential administrative liability pursuant to CWC Section 13399.33(a)(1) for failure to submit a NOI. The second NNC required that the NOI be submitted to the Regional Board's office by June 12, 2009. To date, Cast Industries Corporation has not submitted a NOI for coverage under the General Permit.
10. Pursuant to Section 13399.30(c)(2) of the CWC, if a discharger fails to submit the required NOI to the Regional Board within 60 days from the date on which the original NNC was sent, the Regional Board shall impose the penalties described in subdivision (a) of Section 13399.33 of the CWC.

11. Pursuant to Section 13399.33(a)(1) of the CWC, the Board shall administratively impose civil liability in an amount that is not less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per year of noncompliance or fraction thereof if a discharger, as described in CWC Section 13399.30, fails to obtain coverage under the General Permit after receiving two NNCs pursuant to CWC Section 13399.30, subdivisions (a)(2) and (b), unless the Regional Board makes express findings setting forth the reasons for its failure to do so based on the specific factors set forth in CWC Section 13399.33(a)(2).
12. CWC Section 13399.33(d) provides for staff cost recovery for enforcement actions under Sections 13399.33(a), (b) and (c) of the CWC. Staff spent approximately 13.5 hours for this enforcement action and the total Staff costs are \$1,485 (13.5 hrs @ \$110/hr=\$1,485).

Pursuant to CWC Section 13399.33(a)(1) and CWC Section 13399.33(d), the Assistant Executive Officer recommends that the Regional Board impose administrative civil liability in the amount of six thousand four hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$6,485) on Cast Industries Corporation for civil penalties and to cover the costs of enforcement.

WAIVER OF HEARING

Cast Industries Corporation may waive its right to a hearing. If Cast Industries Corporation chooses to do so, please sign the attached Waiver Form and mail it, together with a check or money order payable to the State Water Resources Control Board-WDPF, for the amount of six thousand four hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$6,485). These documents should be mailed to this office in the enclosed pre-printed envelope.

WAIVER FORM FOR ADMINISTRATIVE CIVIL LIABILITY COMPLAINT

By signing this waiver, I affirm and acknowledge the following:

I am duly authorized to represent Cast Industries Corporation (hereinafter "Discharger") in connection with Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R8-2009-0051 (hereinafter the "Complaint"). I am informed that California Water Code Section 13323, subdivision (b), states that, "a hearing before the regional board shall be conducted within 90 days after the party has been served [with the complaint]. The person who has been issued a complaint may waive the right to a hearing."

(**OPTION 1: Check here if the Discharger waives the hearing requirement and will pay the liability in full.**)

- a. I hereby waive any right the Discharger may have to a hearing before the Regional Board.
- b. I certify that the Discharger will remit payment for the proposed civil liability in the full amount of six thousand four hundred and eighty-five dollars (**\$6,485**) by check that references "Complaint No. R8-2009-0051" made payable to the State Water Resources Control Board -WDPF. Payment must be received by the Regional Board office by **October 29, 2009** or the Regional Board may adopt an Administrative Civil Liability Order requiring payment.

I understand the payment of the above amount constitutes a proposed settlement of the Complaint, and that any settlement will not become final until after the 30-day public notice and comment period. Should the Regional Board receive significant new information or comments from any source (excluding the Regional Board's Prosecution Team) during this comment period, the Regional Board's Assistant Executive Officer may withdraw the Complaint, return payment, and issue a new Complaint. I understand that this proposed settlement is subject to approval by the Executive Officer of the Regional Board, and that the Regional Board may consider this proposed settlement in a public meeting or hearing. I also understand that approval of the settlement will result in the Discharger having waived the right to contest the allegations in the Complaint and the imposition of civil liability.
- d. I understand that payment of the above amount is not a substitute for compliance with applicable laws and that continuing violations of the type alleged in the Complaint may subject the Discharger to further enforcement, including additional civil liability.


Background

The Assistant Executive Officer has issued an Administrative Civil Liability Complaint (hereinafter "Complaint") pursuant to California Water Code Section 13323 against Cast Industries Corporation (hereinafter "Discharger") alleging that it has violated Water Code Section 13399.30(a)(2) and the State's General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity, Order No. 97-03-DWQ, NPDES No. CAS000001 (hereinafter "General Permit") by failing to obtain coverage under the General Permit to discharge storm water associated with industrial activity. The Complaint proposes that administrative civil liability in the amount of six thousand four hundred and eighty-five dollars (\$6,485) be imposed as authorized by Water Code Sections 13399.33(a)(1) and 13399.33(d). A hearing is currently scheduled to be held before the Regional Board during its December 10, 2009 meeting.

Purpose of Hearing

The purpose of the hearing is to consider relevant evidence and testimony regarding the Complaint. At the hearing, the Regional Board will consider whether to issue an administrative civil liability order assessing the proposed liability, or a higher or lower amount, or reject the proposed liability. The public hearing on December 10, 2009 will commence at 9:00 a.m. or as soon thereafter as practicable, or as announced in the Regional Board meeting agenda. The meeting will be held at the City Council Chambers, 400 S. Vicentia Avenue, City of Corona, California. An agenda for the meeting will be issued at least ten days before the meeting and posted on the Regional Board's web page at:

The agenda will include the final hearing date and location, and the estimated start time for the meeting. Since the start time for this item is uncertain, all interested parties are urged to be present from the start of the Board meeting.

Hearing Procedures

The hearing will be conducted in accordance with this hearing procedure. This hearing procedure has been pre-approved by the Regional Board's Advisory Team in model format. A copy of the general procedures governing adjudicatory hearings before the Regional Board may be found at Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, Section 648 et seq., and is available at <http://www.waterboards.ca.gov> or upon request. In accordance with Section 648, subdivision (d), any procedure not provided by this Hearing Procedure is deemed waived. Except as provided in Section 648 and herein, subdivision (b), Chapter 5 of the Administrative Procedures Act (commencing with Section 11500 of the Government Code) does not apply to this hearing.

THE PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES HEREIN MAY BE AMENDED BY THE ADVISORY TEAM AT ITS DISCRETION. ANY OBJECTIONS TO THE HEARING PROCEDURE MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE REGIONAL BOARD'S ADVISORY TEAM BY OCTOBER 22, 2009 OR THEY WILL BE WAIVED. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE DEADLINES AND REQUIREMENTS CONTAINED HEREIN MAY RESULT IN THE EXCLUSION OF DOCUMENTS AND/OR TESTIMONY.

Hearing Participants

Participants in this proceeding are designated as either "parties" or "interested persons." Designated parties to the hearing may present evidence and cross-examine witnesses and are subject to cross-examination. Interested persons generally may not submit evidence, cross-examine witnesses, or be subject to cross examination, but may present policy statements. Policy statements may include comments on any aspect of the proceeding, but may not include evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data). Interested persons who would like to submit evidence may do so if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the procedures and deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from the Regional Board, staff or others, at the discretion of the Regional Board.

The following participants are hereby designated as parties in this proceeding:

- (1) Regional Board Prosecution Team
- (2) Cast Industries Corporation, also referred to as the Discharger

Requesting Designated Party Status

Persons who wish to participate in the hearing as a designated party must request party status by submitting a request in writing (with copies to the existing designated parties) so that it is received by 5 p.m. on October 22, 2009 by Advisory Team Attorney David Rice, Davidrice@waterboards.ca.gov. The request shall include an explanation of the basis for status as a designated party (e.g., how the issues to be addressed in the hearing and the potential actions by the Regional Board affect the person), the information required of designated parties as provided below, and a statement explaining why the party or parties designated above do not adequately represent the person's interest. Any opposition to the request must be received by the Advisory Team, the person requesting party status, and all parties by 5 p.m. on October 29, 2009. The parties will be notified by 5 p.m. on November 5, 2009 in writing whether the request has been granted or denied.

Separation of Functions

To help ensure the fairness and impartiality of this proceeding, the functions of those who will act in a prosecutorial role by presenting evidence for consideration by the Regional Board (Prosecution Team) have been separated from those who will provide advice to the Regional Board (Advisory Team). Members of the Advisory Team are: David Rice, Staff Counsel, State Water Resources Control Board and Gerard Thibeault, Executive Officer, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board. Members of the

Prosecution Team are: Ann Carroll, Office of Enforcement, State Water Resources Control Board; Kurt Berchtold, Assistant Executive Officer, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board; Michael Adackapara, Division Chief, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board; Mark Smythe, Section Chief, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board and Michelle Beckwith, Environmental Scientist, Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board. Any members of the Advisory Team who normally supervise any members of the Prosecution Team are not acting as their supervisors in this proceeding, and vice versa. Members of the Prosecution Team may have acted as advisors to the Regional Board in other, unrelated matters, but they are not advising the Regional Board in this proceeding. Members of the Prosecution Team have not had any ex parte communications with the members of the Regional Board or the Advisory Team regarding this proceeding.

Ex Parte Communications

The designated parties and interested persons are forbidden from engaging in ex parte communications regarding this matter with members of the Advisory Team or members of the Regional Board. An ex parte contact is any written or verbal communication pertaining to the investigation, preparation, or prosecution of the Complaint between a member of a designated party or interested person on the one hand, and a Regional Board member or an Advisory Team member on the other hand, unless the communication is copied to all other designated parties (if written) or made in a manner open to all other designated parties (if verbal). Communications regarding non-controversial procedural matters are not ex parte contacts and are not restricted. Communications among one or more designated parties and interested persons themselves are not ex parte contacts.

Hearing Time Limits

To ensure that all participants have an opportunity to participate in the hearing, the following time limits shall apply: Each designated party shall have a combined 20 minutes to present evidence, cross-examine witnesses (if warranted), and provide a closing statement; and each interested person shall have 3 minutes to present a non-evidentiary policy statement. Participants with similar interests or comments are requested to make joint presentations, and participants are requested to avoid redundant comments. Participants who would like additional time must submit their request to the Advisory Team so that it is received no later than October 22, 2009. Additional time may be provided at the discretion of the Advisory Team (prior to the hearing) or the Regional Board Chair (at the hearing) upon a showing that additional time is necessary.

Submission of Evidence and Policy Statements

The following information must be submitted in advance of the hearing:

1. All evidence (other than witness testimony to be presented orally at the hearing) that the Designated Party would like the Regional Board to consider. Evidence and exhibits already in the public files of the Regional Board may be submitted by reference as long as the exhibits and their location are clearly identified in accordance with Title 23, CCR, Section 648.3.
2. All legal and technical arguments or analysis.
3. The name of each witness, if any, whom the designated party intends to call at the hearing, the subject of each witness' proposed testimony, and the estimated time required by each witness to present direct testimony.
4. The qualifications of each expert witness, if any.
5. If the Discharger intends to argue an inability to pay the civil liability proposed in the Complaint (or an increased or decreased amount as may be imposed by the Regional Board), the Discharger should submit supporting evidence as set forth in the "ACL Fact Sheet" under "Factors that must be considered by the Board."

The Prosecution Team shall submit 15 hard copies of its information and one electronic copy of the information to Advisory Team Attorney David Rice so that it is received by 5 p.m. on November 12, 2009.

The remaining designated parties shall submit 15 hard copies of their information and one electronic copy of the information to Advisory Team Attorney David Rice so that they are received by 5 p.m. on November 12, 2009.

Any designated party that would like to submit information that rebuts the information previously submitted by other designated parties shall submit 15 hard copies of their rebuttal information and one electronic copy of the information to Advisory Team Attorney David Rice so that they are received by 5 p.m. on November 19, 2009. Rebuttal information shall be limited to the scope of the information previously submitted by the other designated parties. Rebuttal information that is not responsive to information previously submitted by other designated parties may be excluded.

If the total amount of information submitted by any party is less than 15 pages, that party may submit the information by email, rather than in writing. In addition to the foregoing, each designated party shall submit (1) one copy of the above information to each of the other designated parties so that it is received by 5 p.m. on the deadline specified above.

Interested persons who would like to submit written non-evidentiary policy statements are encouraged to submit them to the Advisory Team as early as possible, but no later than October 22, 2009. Interested persons do not need to submit written non-evidentiary policy statements in order to speak at the hearing.

In accordance with Title 23, California Code of Regulations, Section 648.4, the Regional Board endeavors to avoid surprise testimony or evidence. Absent a showing of good

cause and lack of prejudice to the parties, the Regional Board may exclude evidence and testimony that is not submitted in accordance with this hearing procedure. Excluded evidence and testimony will not be considered by the Regional Board and will not be included in the administrative record for this proceeding. Power Point and other visual presentations may be used at the hearing, but their content may not exceed the scope of other submitted written material. A copy of such material intended to be presented at the hearing must be submitted to the Advisory Team by November 25, 2009 for inclusion in the administrative record. Additionally, any witness who has submitted written testimony for the hearing shall appear at the hearing and affirm that the written testimony is true and correct, and shall be available for cross-examination.

Request for Pre-hearing Conference

A designated party may request that a pre-hearing conference be held before the hearing in accordance with Water Code Section 13228.15. A pre-hearing conference may address any of the matters described in subdivision (b) of Government Code Section 11511.5. Requests must contain a description of the issues proposed to be discussed during that conference, and must be submitted to the Advisory Team, with a copy to all other designated parties, as early as practicable.

Evidentiary Objections

Any designated party objecting to written evidence or exhibits submitted by another designated party must submit a written objection to the Advisory Team and all other designated parties so that it is received by 5 p.m. on November 25, 2009. The Advisory Team will notify the parties about further action to be taken on such objections and when that action will be taken.

Evidentiary Documents and File

The Complaint and related evidentiary documents are on file and may be inspected or copied at the Regional Board office at 3737 Main Street, Suite 500, Riverside, CA 92501 by contacting August Lucas (email: alucas@waterboards.ca.gov; phone: 951-782-7961). This file shall be considered part of the official administrative record for this hearing. Other submittals received for this proceeding will be added to this file and will become a part of the administrative record absent a contrary ruling by the Regional Board Chair. - October 22, 2009: Deadline for objections, if any, to proposed Hearing Procedure.
- October 22, 2009: Deadline for requests for designated party status.
- October 22, 2009: Interested Persons' deadline for written non-evidentiary policy statements.
- October 29, 2009: Deadline for oppositions to requests for designated party status.
- November 5, 2009: Advisory Team issues decision on requests for designated party status, if any.
- November 12, 2009: Prosecution Team's deadline for all information required under "Submission of Evidence and Policy Statements,"
- November 12, 2009: Remaining Designated Parties' Deadline for all information required under "Submission of Evidence and Policy Statements."

November 19, 2009: All Designated Parties' deadline for rebuttal information, evidentiary objections, and requests for additional time at the hearing, if any.

December 10, 2009: Public Hearing.
