YOU ARE HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

1. The Yucaipa Valley Water District is alleged to have violated provisions of law for which the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (Regional Board) must impose mandatory penalties pursuant to California Water Code (Water Code) Section 13385.
2. A hearing concerning this complaint may be held before the Regional Board within 90 days of the date of issuance of this complaint, unless Yucaipa Valley Water District waives its right to a hearing. If the hearing in this matter is not waived, the hearing will be held during the Board's regular meeting on February 21, 2003 in the City of Loma Linda. The meeting will begin at 9:00 a.m. Yucaipa Valley Water District or its representatives will have an opportunity to appear and be heard and to contest the allegations in this complaint and the imposition of mandatory penalties by the Regional Board.
3. This complaint is based on the following facts:
 - A.) On June 01, 2001, the Regional Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 01-009 (NPDES No. CA0105619), for Yucaipa Valley Water District. These requirements regulate discharges of waste from the District's Henry N. Wochholz Municipal Wastewater Treatment Plant.
 - B.) Yucaipa Valley Water District submitted self-monitoring reports (June 2000 through June 2001) which show violations of effluent limits for total inorganic nitrogen, total chlorine residual, pH, 7-day median coliform, the discharge of un-disinfected effluent, and turbidity. These violations are summarized on Attachment "A", which is Page 3 of this complaint.
4. Water Code Section 13385 (i)(2) requires the Regional Board to assess a mandatory minimum penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each violation, not counting the first three non-serious violations in each six-month period.

5. In accordance with Water Code Section 13385(i), the mandatory minimum penalty for the violations that occurred from June 2000 to June 2001 is \$84,000, which is based on twenty-eight (28) effluent limit violations at \$3,000 each.
6. In accordance with Water Code Section 13385(c), the Regional Board may impose administrative civil liability for thirty (30) violations. The maximum administrative civil liability that may be imposed for these violations is \$300,000.
7. The Executive Officer proposes that mandatory minimum penalties of \$84,000 be imposed on Yucaipa Valley Water District by the Board for the violations cited above.
8. YVWD has indicated that it wishes to waive its right to a hearing in this matter. YVWD has also agreed to participate in a supplemental environmental project (SEP) that will benefit the Upper Santa Ana Watershed. The proposed SEP is to contribute \$49,500 of the assessed liability towards cleanup of the perchlorate contamination in the Colton-Rialto area. The balance of the assessment (\$34,500) shall be paid to the State Water Resources Control Board. An invoice for this amount is inclosed.

Yucaipa Valley Water District also agrees to participate in a supplemental environmental project (SEP). The balance of the assessment (\$49,500) will be contributed towards abating the perchlorate groundwater contamination in the Colton-Rialto area and payment is being forwarded to the Regional Board office.
