YOU ARE HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

1. Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) is alleged to have violated provisions of law for which the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (Regional Board), must impose mandatory penalties pursuant to California Water Code (Water Code) Section 13385.
2. A hearing concerning this complaint will be held before the Regional Board within 90 days of the date of issuance of this complaint, unless IEUA waives its right to a hearing. Waiver procedures are specified on Page 2 of this complaint. If the hearing in this matter is not waived, the hearing will be held during the Regional Board's regular meeting on June 29, 2007 at the Council Chambers of the City of Loma Linda, 25541 Barton Road, Loma Linda, California. The meeting will begin at 9:00 a.m. IEUA or its representatives will have an opportunity to appear and be heard and to contest the allegations in this complaint and the imposition of mandatory penalties by the Regional Board.
3. This complaint is based on the following facts:
 - a. On January 19, 2001, the Regional Board adopted Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order No. 01-1 (NPDES No. CA0105279), for IEUA. These requirements regulated discharges of waste from IEUA's Regional Plant No. 1 (RP-1) and Regional Plant No. 4 (RP-4) until May 19, 2006. Currently, waste discharges from IEUA's RP-1 and RP-4 are regulated under WDRs Order No. R8-2006-0010, adopted by the Regional Board on May 19, 2006, as replacement of WDRs Order No. 01-1.
 - b. IEUA submitted self-monitoring reports (January 2004 – July 2006) from RP-1/RP-4, which show that IEUA exceeded the effluent limits for chlorine residual, turbidity, and total coliform. These violations are summarized on Attachment "A", which is Page 3 of this complaint.

4. Water Code Sections 13385(h) and (i) require the Regional Board to assess a mandatory minimum penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each serious and chronic violation, not counting the first three chronic violations in each six-month period.
5. As shown in Attachment "A", IEUA incurred a total of thirteen violations between January 2004 and July 2006. For the thirty-one-month period covered by Complaint No. R8-2007-0033, one chronic violation that occurred between September 2004 and February 2005 is not subject to mandatory penalty assessment. Also, six chronic violations of effluent limits for turbidity that occurred during March 2005 are treated as one violation and part of a single operational upset as defined under Water Code Section 13385(f)(1).
6. Seven violations out of the total of thirteen violations are subject to mandatory minimum penalties of \$3,000 for each violation. In accordance with Water Code Sections 13385(h) and (i), the mandatory minimum penalties for the seven effluent limit violations cited in Attachment "A" are \$21,000.
7. You may waive your right to a hearing. If you waive your right to a hearing, please sign the attached waiver, which is Page 4 of this complaint, and return it together with a check payable to the State Water Resources Control Board in the amount of the mandatory penalties proposed in paragraph 6, above. Send the check and waiver form to this office in the enclosed pre-printed envelope.
