2. Public Forum

There were no speakers.

3. State Water Resources Control Board Liaison Report

Tam Doduc, State Board Liaison, briefly discussed a number of issues that are being proposed for consideration by the State Board this year, including the adoption of the construction storm water permit. Ms. Doduc said that the State legislature has their attention on the Bay Delta. Ms. Doduc also said that the Joint Assembly and Senate Committee has held three hearings covering a wide-range of issues from urban conservation to agricultural water management, to creation of a delta commission or conservancy, to changing water right diversion reporting requirements. The legislature's intention is to get a package ready to send to the governor in September.

Ms. Doduc indicated that there are a couple of workshops coming up in September. The workshops will cover staff's proposal on water rights, reduction in water quality fees, and the Once-Through Cooling Policy. Also, after the proposed septic tank regulations were released earlier this year, public input was received at several workshops conducted throughout the state. As a result, staff has been working to revise the regulations and expects to have them ready for discussion by November.

Ms. Doduc thanked Regional Board staff for the great job they are doing.

4. Approval of the Minutes:

Action: It was moved by Member Freschi, seconded by Member Van Gundy and unanimously approved that the Board Meeting Minutes of July 20, 2009 and the Workshop Minutes of August 3, 2009, be adopted as presented.

Update: City of Beaumont requested Item No. *7 be removed from the consent calendar and be considered separately, in order to discuss the possibility of removing a specific paragraph in the Order that would not pertain to them.

Action: It was moved by Member Ruh, seconded by Member Freschi, and unanimously approved that the Board adopt Orders No. R8-2009-0054, R8-2009-0012 and R8-2009-0009, as presented.

7. Amendment of Order No. R8-2006-0003 (NPDES No. CA0105376), Waste Discharge and Producer/User Water Recycling Requirements for the City of Beaumont, Waste Water Treatment Plant No. 1, Riverside County - Order No. R8-2009-0002

Speakers:

Joe Reichenberger, Patsy Reely, Mark Wildermuth, and Hisam Baqai, all had an opportunity to express their concern. A discussion between Board staff, Board members and Board Attorney David Rice took place, and a revised recommendation was made by Board staff.

Staff recommended adoption of the permit, as proposed with the errata sheet, and further recommended deleting the last sentence of finding 9 of the Order.

Action: It was moved by Member Ruh, seconded by Member Freschi, and unanimously approved that the Board adopt Order No. R8-2009-0002, as presented with errata, and deleting the sentence on page 2 of 8, finding 9 of the Order, that reads, "*A negative declaration for discharges from the new discharge points was certified on April 8, 2009.*"

9. Review of Board Staff's Approach in Implementing Cleanup and Abatement Order (CAO) No. 98-112 - Wahl's Texaco, Big Bear Lake or McWhirter Real Estate & Investment Company (McWhirter) (information item).

Ken Williams, Chief of the Underground Storage Tanks Section, presented the staff report. Mr. Williams stated that a remedial action plan was to be submitted by McWhirter Real Estate & Investment Company (McWhirter) by September 7, 2009, in accordance with Item 4 of CAO No. 98-112. Mr. Williams explained why the remedial action plan was necessary.

On behalf of McWhirter, Mr. Duke Peters explained why McWhirter should not be required to submit a remedial action plan in accordance with Item 4 of CAO No. 98-112. Board Chair Beswick expressed her concurrence with Board staff's current course of action.

10. Potential Repeal of Riverside County Prohibition on New Conventional Septic Systems in Cherry Valley Community of Interest (information item).

Xinyu Li, Staff Engineering Geologist, presented a review of a recent action by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors regarding the recommendation by the Groundwater Quality Evaluation Committee (Committee) (a committee of local residents) to repeal County Ordinance 871, which established a prohibition on the use of new conventional septic systems in the Cherry Valley Community of Interest (CVCOI). Dr. Li summarized the recommendations made by the Committee, which was convened by Supervisor Ashley. One of the recommendations is to repeal County Ordinance 871. Dr. Li stated that Board staff disagrees with the proposal to repeal ordinance 871, and that Board staff supports the findings of the Wildermuth Environmental, Inc., report. Dr Li also discussed the options for follow-up action by the Regional Board should the prohibition be repealed.
