Motion: It was moved by Board Member Ackerman, seconded by Board Member von Blasingame, and unanimously carried to adopt Orders No. R8-2014-0006, R8-2014-0009, R8-2014-0035, R8-2014-0041, and approve the exemption from the minimum lot size requirements requested by Carlos Navarro, as presented.

14. Basin Plan Amendments to Incorporate Revisions to the Salt Management Plan for the Santa Ana Region - Resolution No. R8-2014-0005

Hope Smythe, Division Chief, presented this item. Ms. Smythe provided an overview of the proposed Basin Plan amendments that were discussed in detail at the January 31, 2014 hearing/workshop. She reviewed the comments received and discussed proposed revisions to the Basin Plan amendments in response to the comments. Ms. Smythe also discussed Basin Planning requirements for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and finally, presented staff's recommendation.

Motion: It was moved by Board Member Longville, seconded by Board Member von Blasingame, and unanimously carried to adopt Resolution No. R8-2014-0005, with the amendments to the Basin Plan shown in the attachments to the Resolution to amend Chapter 2 (Plans and Policies), Chapter 3 (Beneficial Uses), and Chapter 5 (Implementation Plan - Salt Management Plan).

Executive Officer Berchtold thanked Ms. Smythe and other staff for the extensive amount of work that went into this Basin Plan amendment.

Member Longville added that this was a reasonable solution to meet the challenges we are facing.

15. Evaluation of Newport Bay Watershed Monitoring Programs - (Information item)

Mr. Ken Schiff, Deputy Director of the Southern California Coastal Water Research Project (SCCWRP), presented this item. Mr. Schiff provided a report on the evaluation of the Newport Bay Watershed Monitoring Programs, a project SCCWRP undertook for the Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board. He started with some background on SCCWRP and the work that they do. He briefly discussed SCCWRP's recommendations for improving the monitoring programs and indicated that the report can be found on their website <http://www.sccwrp.org/documents/TechnicalReports.aspx>.

16. Status Update on Draft Orange County MS4 Permit (information item)

Adam Fischer, Regional Board staff, presented an introduction to the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit program. Mr. Fischer explained that the Permit program is based on Section 402(p) of the Clean Water Act and implementing regulations. He described the permit's evolution since 1990, and proposed a two-part strategy for the development of the next Orange County MS4 Permit: first, incorporate key features of the permittees' documented programs into the language of the Permit, and second, incorporate the "iterative process" for program improvements. Mr. Fischer described the intent of this strategy to allow flexibility within the boundaries of the permitted area and to provide better feedback, increase effectiveness and efficiency of the permittees' programs and improve water quality. Mr. Fischer presented two conceptual models of the "iterative process" and laid out a timeline for the anticipated adoption of a renewed Permit in September 2014.

17. Regional Board Member and Executive Officer Communications

Executive Officer Berchtold announced that there was a WQCC meeting coming up in October with a possible field trip.

Board Member Longville said she had attended Region 8's staff appreciation luncheon at the Citrus Park.
