SUBJECT: Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements, Order No. R8-2007-0015

DISCUSSION:

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (hereinafter Board), finds that:

1. The Orders listed in Attachment "A" were issued by the Board at various times for the facilities described therein. Attachment "A" is hereby made a part of this Order. Waste discharge requirements for the facilities listed in Attachment "A" are no longer necessary because the facility discharge has ceased, the facility has complied with the enforcement order, or the facility will be regulated pursuant to the terms and conditions of the State Board's general industrial storm water permit, Order No. 97-03-DWQ.
2. This action is based on the fact that specific discharges are now covered under other waste discharge requirements, or that discharges from the facilities have ceased. As such, this action is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act in accordance with Section 15061 (b) (3), Chapter 3, Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations.
3. The Board has notified the dischargers and interested agencies and persons of its intent to rescind the Orders for the facilities listed in Attachment "A", and has provided them with an opportunity to submit written comments and recommendations.
4. The Board, in a public meeting, heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of waste discharge requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Orders listed in Attachment "A" be rescinded.

**RESOLUTION NO. R8-2007-009
RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE CHINO CREEK INTEGRATED PLAN**

WHEREAS, THE California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Santa Ana Region (hereinafter, Regional Board), finds that:

1. Prado Basin is an essential flood control facility within the Santa Ana Region that protects downstream property from flood damage and provides for water conservation.
2. The Chino Creek Watershed is tributary to Prado Basin.
3. Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and other local tributaries are valuable resources possessing many vital attributes including, but not limited to, support of wildlife, water quality enhancement, active and passive recreation, and public education.
4. Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and other local tributaries are home to one of the most successful endangered species recovery programs in the United States due to the resource management efforts of the Orange County Water District and the Santa Ana Watershed Association.
5. The Prado Basin stakeholders, including Regional Board staff, and staff of more than 25 other stakeholder agencies, have been meeting monthly for four years.
6. The Prado Basin stakeholders collectively believe that the beneficial uses such as flood control, water conservation, wildlife habitat, water quality enhancement, active and passive recreation, and public education, of Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and other local tributaries should be preserved and restored.
7. The beneficial uses of Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and local other tributaries are key components supporting the quality of life in the region and directly benefit the community by providing urban refuge and retreat opportunities as well as protection of the environment.
8. As part of a State Water Resources Control Board grant project, the Prado Basin stakeholders have completed the Chino Creek Integrated Plan for the lower Chino Creek Watershed and its tributaries.
9. The Chino Creek Integrated Plan includes a compilation and description of baseline conditions within the Chino Creek Watershed, a description of the project plan formulation (which included an intensive two-day consensus-building workshop involving 57 attendees), and a description of multi-purpose projects that will enhance the Chino Creek watershed and the greater Prado Basin area.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Regional Board does hereby determine and order as follows:

1. That the beneficial uses of the Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and other local tributaries, as described above benefit the community as a whole.
2. Where possible and appropriate the goals and findings of the lower Chino Creek Integrated Plan should be utilized for guidance on how to preserve, restore and improve the Prado Basin, the Chino Creek Watershed, and other local tributaries.
