NOTICE OF PUBLIC WORKSHOPS Proposition 1

The State Water Resources Control Board's (State Water Board) Division of Financial Assistance (Division) will hold three public workshops to provide information regarding the Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Proposition 1). The primary purpose of these workshops will be to give stakeholders an opportunity to provide State Water Board staff with feedback on the draft guidelines for Small Community Wastewater funding available from Proposition 1.

In addition, stakeholders will have the opportunity to provide State Water Board staff with input on the draft guidelines for the Clean, Safe, and Reliable Drinking Water funding, and hear updates on the Proposition 1 funding opportunities for Water Recycling, Stormwater, and Groundwater Sustainability.

Background

Proposition 1 (Assembly Bill 1471, Rendon) authorized \$7.545 billion in general obligation bonds for water projects including surface and groundwater storage, ecosystem and watershed protection and restoration, and drinking water protection. The State Water Board will administer Proposition 1 funds for five programs: wastewater, water recycling, drinking water, stormwater, and groundwater. The implementation schedule for each program will vary. Proposition 1 requires the creation of funding guidelines through a transparent and public process. Section 79706(b) of Proposition 1 requires at least three public meetings throughout the state to consider public comments prior to finalizing funding guidelines. In addition, the draft guidelines must be posted on the internet at least 30 days before the public meetings.

Document Availability

Proposition 1 (Section 79723) allocates \$260 million to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Small Community Grant (SCG) Fund for wastewater treatment projects. The State Water Board's existing SCG funds are currently administered consistent with the CWSRF Intended Use Plan (IUP) and the CWSRF Policy. Administering the SCG funds as part of the CWSRF Program allows applicants to easily leverage the SCG funds with low-interest financing available through the CWSRF Program. The CWSRF IUP is generally updated on an annual basis.

The Draft State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2015-16 CWSRF IUP has been modified to incorporate information regarding implementation of Section 79723 of Proposition 1. Information relating to grant eligibility and funding maximums is in Table 4. The three public workshops described above will provide State Water Board staff with an opportunity to answer questions and receive comments on the Draft SFY 2015-16 CWSRF IUP, which is posted online at: http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water-issues/programs/grants-loans/small-community-wastew-ater-grant/projects.shtml
