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Water Recycling Funding Program

The Water Recycling Funding Program offers grants and loans to local agencies to plan, design and construct water recycling facilities. Authorization is provided through:

- The Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach protection Act of 2002 (Proposition 50).
- The Seawater Intrusion Control Loan Fund (SWIC), and
- The Clean Water Bond Law of 1984 ('84 Bond)
- The Costa Machado Water Act of 2000 (Proposition 13),
- The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF), and
- The Water Quality, Supply, and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 (Proposition 1)

^{*}Proposition 1 authorized \$725 million; Department of Water Resources (DWR) will administer the remaining \$100 million for desalinization projects.

^{**} Proposition 1 authorized \$900 million; DWR will administer the remaining \$100 million to fund projects that develop groundwater management plans

Proposition 1 Recycled Water Funding

- \$625 million is proposed for recycled water funding (administered by SWRCB) with the remaining \$100 million for desalination (administered by DWR).
- Funding will be used to promote use of treated municipal wastewater to offset and augment state/ local fresh water supplies.
- In general, the funding will be allocated to the State Water Board as:

50% for loans (~\$300 million)

50% for grants (~\$300 million)

Construction Financing

- Interest: 1/2 General
 Obligation Bond Rate
- **Term**: 20 year
- Allowance: 15% of the eligible financing amount for design and construction allowances
- Interest: 1/2 General Obligation Bond Rate*
- **Term**: 30 year
- Allowance: Follows the CWSRF Policy

^{* 1%} financing available through CWSRF for a limited time

Program Guidelines Construction Grants

Existing

• State Share: 25%

• **Maximum Grant:** \$5,000,000

 Allowance: 15% of the eligible grant amount for design and construction allowances

Proposed

- State Share: 35% (40% for SDAC)
- Maximum Grant: \$15,000,000 (\$20,000,000 for SDAC)
- Allowance: 15% of the eligible grant amount for construction management, contingency, and other construction allowances

Water Recycling Funding Program Guidelines

- The draft amended Water Recycling Funding Program guidelines and the proposed plan to implement Proposition 1 Water Recycling funding were posted on Thursday, March 12th.
- Stakeholders will have the opportunity to provide State Water Board staff with feedback and input on the draft guidelines.
- Comments are due Friday April 24, 2015.
- Anticipate presenting draft Guidelines to the State Water Board in June 2015. Implementation would begin in July 2015 if approved by the Board.





Prop 1 Eligible Applicants

Eligible applicants include:


- Local public agencies
- Privately owned water utilities regulated by the Public Utilities Commission
- Non-profit organizations
- Federally recognized Indian Tribes
- State Indian Tribes listed on the Native American Heritage Commission's California Tribal Consultation List
- Mutual Water Companies

(note: may not apply to all funding sources)

Process

- Division of Financial Assistance (DFA) will utilize a single application.
- Streamlines the funding process and allows water recycling grants/ financing to be easily combined with other funding sources administered by DFA.
- Applications will be accepted continuously.
- Eligible projects are funded in the order application are completed and approved.
