Data contained on this website represents the information available on **community and non-transient non-community (specifically schools and day cares)** public drinking water systems that are regulated by the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) or Local Primacy Agency (LPA). Please note that the State Water Board's regulatory authority **does not include water systems that are defined as "state small water systems", "local state small water systems" or private domestic wells**. You should review any notices you receive directly from your drinking water supplier, as these notices may contain more recent information than the statewide data currently available on this website. Please note that a water system may not be included in the website's map or downloadable data files because it meets one of the following conditions:

- Public drinking water systems that exceed a state standard for a contaminant for which there is no federal standard. Examples of such "state-only" standards are hexavalent chromium and perchlorate.
- Public drinking water systems for which current monitoring data has not been reported, such that actual exceedance/compliance status is unknown at this time.
- Public drinking water systems that are in violation of a federal standard for which no enforcement action has been taken.
- Public drinking water systems with a total coliform violation. These violations will be reported to the Safe Drinking Water Information System (SDWIS) when the State Board adopts the California revised Total Coliform Rule (rTCR), which is expected to occur in fall 2017.
