The following comments/ materials pertain to the revised State-USFS Waiver and are in addition to our prior timely submission and comments at the previous Waiver hearing.

We are including Watershed Improvement Needs (WIN) inventory data we have received from the USFS in response to a FOIA Request dated July 5, 2011. Many of the forests have not yet responded with inventory data, and so the FOIA is still in process of being fulfilled. As presented in my public comments at the first State Waterboard hearing, there is an alarming number of legacy and ongoing water quality impacts ("legacy impacts") on the eleven national forests in the Sierra Nevada. I requested the Waterboard examine the Forest Service WIN inventory data because it highlights the ongoing failure of the existing BMP program to avoid adverse water quality impacts from logging, road-building, culvert failures, grazing and other stressors on public lands. These data sheets highlight problems, that magnitude of which demonstrate recent ongoing harm to water quality and aquatic resources. The BMP program must address these legacy issues with a clear timeline for restoration and strengthening measures that will halt this ongoing significant degradation.

The Forest Service FOIA request is ongoing and we will continue to highlight to the Waterboard and USFS that need to address these alarming legacy issues with appropriate BMP's and adequate monitoring.
