

TRANSMITTAL OF REGIONAL BOARD RESOLUTION R09-004 AND THE 2008 LOS ANGELES REGION INTEGRATED REPORT CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 305(B) REPORT AND SECTION 303(D) LIST OF IMPAIRED

WATERS.

At a Regional Board hearing held on July 16, 2009, the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board adopted the 2008 Los Angeles Region Integrated Report Clean Water Act Section 305(b) Report and Section 303(d) List of Impaired Waters. The Clean Water Act requires each State to assess the status of water quality in the State (Section 305(b)), and provide a list of impaired water bodies (Section 303(d)) to the USEPA every two years. For water quality limited segments included on the 303(d) List, the state is required to develop a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) or take other action to address the impairment.

By copy of this memorandum, I am transmitting Regional Board Resolution R09-004 and the requested portions of the administrative record in electronic format for the "2008 Los Angeles Region Integrated Report Clean Water Act Section 305(b) Report and Section 303(d) List of Impaired Waters" to the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board).
