PROPOSED SUPPLEMENTAL DECREE CONFIRMING STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD ACTION AND ENTERING BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS RELATED TO ADJUDICATED RIGHTS J000014, J000015, J000016, J000017, J000018, J000019, J000020, J000021

Having received and fully considered the State Water Resources Control Board's report recommending a supplemental decree in the above-entitled case to change the place of use and add preservation or enhancement of fish and wildlife resources to the below-described rights. and good cause appearing therefrom, the Court issues the following order.

## IT HEREBY IS ORDERED:

The Decree of this Court entered on December 30, 1932 and modified on October 30, 1956 in the proceeding entitled: In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights Based Upon Prior Appropriation, of the Various Claimants to the Use of the Waters of the Shasta River and Its Tributaries in the Siskiyou County, California, No. 7035 ("the Decree") is hereby modified as follows:

- a. The rights listed below shall be confirmed to include the beneficial use of dedication of water to instream flows under section 1707 of the Water Code.
- b. The purpose of use for Petitioner's Rights is modified to include fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement.
- c. The place of use for the water rights identified below is modified to include portions of Hole in the Ground Creek, Little Springs Creek, Big Springs Creek, and the Shasta River as described more fully below.
- d. Paragraph 233 of the Decree is hereby amended as follows:
  - i. Add "fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement" to the purpose of use listed for Points of Diversion 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, and 172.
  - ii. The location of the place of use for fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement for Points of Diversion 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, and 172 is modified to include the reach within Hole in the Ground Creek and the Shasta River from the upstream limit located at Point of Diversion 168 (North 2,459,391 feet and East 6,445,691 feet by California Coordinate System 1983, Zone 1, being within SE ¼ of SW ¼ of Section 9, T43N, R5W, MDB&M) to the downstream limit located at the United States Geological Survey Gage No. 11517500 (Shasta River near Yreka, Ca) (North 2,548,013 feet and East 6,399,633 feet, Zone 1, being within SE ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 24, T46N, R7W, MDB&M).
  - iii. The quantity of the decreed right that may be used for fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement is the consumptive portion of the total 1.50

cubic feet per second ("cfs") recognized in the Decree for Points of Diversion 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, and 172, according to the following schedule:

The location of the place of use for fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement for Point of Diversion 241 is modified to include the reach within Big Springs Creek and the Shasta River from the upstream limit located at Point of Diversion 241 (North 2,466,096 feet and East 6,449,691 feet by California Coordinate System 1983, Zone 1, being within SE ¼ of SW ¼ of Section 3, T43N, R5W, MDB&M) to the downstream limit located at the United States Geological Survey Gage No. 11517500 (Shasta River near Yreka, Ca) (North 2,548,013 feet and East 6,399,633 feet, Zone 1, being within SE ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 24, T46N, R7W, MDB&M).

iii. The quantity of the decreed right that may be used for fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement is The Nature Conservancy's consumptive portion of the total 10.00 cubic feet per second ("cfs") recognized in the Decree for Point of Diversion 241, according to the following schedule:

and East 6,445,305 feet by California Coordinate System 1983, Zone 1. being within SW ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 9, T43N, R5W, MDB&M) to the downstream limit located at the United States Geological Survey Gage No. 11517500 (Shasta River near Yreka, Ca) (North 2,548,013 feet and East 6,399,633 feet, Zone 1, being within SE ¼ of NE ¼ of Section 24, T46N. R7W, MDB&M).

This Court issued a decree on December 30, 1932 in The Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights Based Upon Prior Appropriation, of the Various Claimants to the Use of the Waters of the Shasta River and Its Tributaries in the Siskiyou County, California, No. 7035 ("the Decree"). On May 8, 2014, the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Board") approved petitions by The Nature Conservancy, which holds water rights under the Decree, to dedicate a portion of its water rights to in-stream use for the purpose of fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement. A copy of the State Board's order is attached to this report as Exhibit 1.

Water Code section 1707 specifically authorizes the holder of a water right to petition the State Board for an order approving a change in use (and attendant changes) of those rights for the purpose of "preserving or enhancing wetlands habitat, fish and wildlife resources, or recreation in, or on, water." Water Code § 1707 (a). The State Board may approve the petition upon a determination that the proposed change will not result in an increased entitlement to use water, will not unreasonably affect any other legal user of water and otherwise meets the requirements of Division 2 of the Water Code. Pursuant to Water Code section 2819, a supplemental decree shall be issued for any change authorized by Water Code section 1707. As described below, the State Board gave notice of the petitioned-for changes, resolved all protests to the proposed changes, and issued an Order granting the petitions. Therefore, the State Board respectfully requests that a supplemental decree reflecting the terms of the Order be entered by the Court.

## FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL DECREE

On July 18, 2012, The Nature Conservancy petitioned the State Board for changes to its decreed rights (which were assigned by the State Board the following numbers: J000014, J000015, J000016, J000017, J000018, J000019, J000020, J000021)<sup>1</sup> on Big Springs Creek, Hole in the Ground Creek, the Shasta River, and Little Springs Creek, all of which were the subject of the Decree. These changes would allow The Nature Conservancy to leave a portion of its water rights in-stream during the irrigation season for the purpose of fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement at Points of Diversion 167, 168, 169, 170, 171, 172, 241, 243, 244, 245, 246, 247, and 248.<sup>2</sup> As the holder of pre-1914 rights, The Nature Conservancy is not required to obtain approval to change the purpose or place of use for its rights. Water Code § 1706. However, The

For record keeping purposes, the State Board assigns adjudicated water rights a "J" number, which allows the Board to record and track the rights.

Nature Conservancy submitted its petition to ensure that the changes in its water rights would be adequately documented and enforceable.

The State Board gave public notice of The Nature Conservancy's petitions on November 8, 2012. Six parties filed protests to the petition: Rice Livestock, Emmerson Investments Inc., Siskiyou County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Grenada Irrigation District, the Shasta River Watermaster, and Siskiyou County Water Users Association. Prior to issuance of the final Order, Emmerson Investments Inc., Siskiyou County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, and the Shasta River Watermaster dismissed their protests on the condition that the Order would include provisions to address their concerns. Rice Livestock and the Grenada Irrigation District abandoned their protests. The State Board determined the issues raised by the Siskiyou County Water Users Association did not raise a valid ground for protest. Therefore, all of the issues raised by the protestants were resolved by the State Board's Order. A detailed description of the protests and their resolution is included in the Order. See Exhibit 1 at p. 4-6.

The State Board gave notice of the issuance of its final order on May 8, 2014 and provided a copy of the Order to each of the protestants. No party requested reconsideration of the Order pursuant to Water Code section 1122.

The State Board's Order approves the addition of fish and wildlife preservation and enhancement and a modification of the place of use to include areas within the reaches of the Shasta River, Little Springs Creek, Big Springs Creek, and Hole in the Ground Creek, as more specifically described in the attached Order. The State Board specifically found that the petitioned-for changes do not injure any lawful user of water, initiate a new right or interfere with the Decree. The State Board further found that the changes are in the public interest and will not adversely affect public trust resources. Therefore, the Order approves the petitioned-for changes.

The State Board respectfully requests that the Court enter the proposed supplemental decree reflecting these changes.
