ATTACHMENT A

Decision 1030 (P. 13), in 1961, specifies that the initial assignment of the water right application from the Department of Finance to the Sonoma District included 8000 acre feet of water for use in Mendocino County and 16,000 acre feet for use in Sonoma County in addition to the 37,544 acre feet of water to be exported from the Russian River Valley to other parts of Sonoma and Marin Counties (P. 24). The Sonoma County users were given ten years to "exercise their preferred right to contract for project water after which time any water not contracted for should be made available for use elsewhere. No time limit need be specified for use of the Mendocino District's share of project water . . ." (P.35).

A total of 212 cfs was allowed to be diverted by the Sonoma District (92 cfs), Mendocino Diverters (53 cfs) and Sonoma Diverters (67 cfs) (P.45).

The right to export water from the Russian River Valley under the permits considered was subject to depletion by consumptive use of 8000 acre feet in Mendocino County and 10,000 acre feet in Sonoma County (P. 46).

Also, "the Mendocino District will have an opportunity to acquire a greater portion of the Coyote Valley Project and/or share in any additional water above the minimum safe yield thereof . . ." (P.47).

Decision 74-30, in 1974, splits the original Permit #12947 into Permit #12947A for the Sonoma District, and Permit #12947B for the Mendocino District, plus a residual amount for Sonoma County users with no specific permit number. Under this decision the amount of water allocated is 37,544 acre feet for the Sonoma District, 8000 acre feet for the Mendocino District and 10,000 acre feet for the individual diverters in Sonoma County. Decision 74-30 still recognizes that the "Mendocino District will have an opportunity to acquire a greater portion of the Coyote Valley Project . . ." (P.12).

Decision 1610, which was adopted in 1986 to allow for Sonoma District's diversion of additional Warm Springs Dam water, recognizes the Sonoma District's diversion of 37,544 acre feet under Permit #12947A (P. 11), and Mendocino District's diversion of 8000 acre feet under Permit #12947B (P.36). The Board did not increase the amount of water reserved for Sonoma County Diverters from 10,000 acre feet to 16,000 acre feet as requested by the Alexander Valley Association (P.39).

The net result of these Decisions appear to initially recognize a use of 37,544 acre feet in the Sonoma District, 8000 acre feet in the Mendocino District, and 16,000 acre feet by Sonoma Diverters, all from the firm yield of the Lake Mendocino Project. Later decisions only recognize 10,000 acre feet being used by the individual Sonoma County Diverters. This appears to leave 6000 acre feet of firm yield available from the Lake Mendocino Project, with the Mendocino District having the opportunity to obtain this additional yield as recognized in Decision 1030.
