2015 – Present: Ongoing negotiations with BOR, NOAA/NMFS and other members of the Fish Passage Steering Committee relative to the NMFS 2009 Biological Opinion on the 2004 OCAP, regarding Fish Passage, Salmon Restoration, and genetic testing of winter-run salmon in New Zealand.

2015: Represented Environmental Justice Coalition for Water and the Winnemem Wintu Tribe on the California Water Commission's Water Storage Investment Program Stakeholder Advisory Committee.

2010 – 2014: Represented the Tribe in various NGO committees regarding IWRMP, Watershed Restoration, Water Storage, and Leg and Policy.

2009: Facilitated negotiations between NOAA/NMFS, New Zealand Fisheries and the Winnemem Wintu for the possible reintroduction of salmon into the McCloud River

2008: Represented the Tribe as a Stakeholder in the Delta Vision Stakeholders and Coordination Group

2007-2008: Advisory Committee Member for the State Water Plan Update 2009.

2006 - Present: coordinate Tribal litigation and litigation priorities on salmon and water issues.

2005: Testified before the Little Hoover Commission in regards to Governance of the CALFED Bay Delta Program (September 2005)

2004 – Present: Ongoing and intermittent negotiations with BOR regarding the proposed enlargement of Shasta Dam.

2004 & 2014: Negotiated terms with BOR for Special Use Permits to hold traditional War Dances on Shasta Dam.

2004-2005: Represented the Tribe on California Bay Delta Authority (CBDA) Environmental Justice Committee and through that Committee submitted testimony, recommendation and a proposed resolution to the Bay-Delta Public Advisory Committee(BDPAC) (June 2005) for the removal of the proposed Shasta Dam enlargement project from further consideration by CALFED.

2004: Designated as the Governmental Liaison by Tribal Leadership to represent the Tribal matters of concern in various forums.

1993 – 2003: Underwent specific training to understand threats to Tribal Cultural Properties, Sacred Sites, and Cultural Resources, and how to address them.
