In 2007, Regional San completed its Water Recycling Opportunities Study, which has helped guide Regional San's vision for water recycling. Currently, Regional San provides tertiary treatment and disinfection for a relatively small portion of the Sacramento Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant (SRWTP) effluent, and Regional San holds a master wastewater reclamation permit that authorizes up to 10 million gallons per day (mgd) of recycled water production, with distribution through the Sacramento County Water Agency. To date, up to about 3.5 mgd has been utilized under this permit, in the City of Elk Grove. Regional San recently developed a recycled water fill station at the SRWTP that makes water available to tanker trucks, street sweeping, residential customers and other uses, and is evaluating the development of a distribution system to expand that program. Regional San anticipates that in 2017 it will begin to provide approximately 1,000 acre-feet of recycled water to a cogeneration facility, which may in turn open up further recycled water opportunities in the City of Sacramento that could rely on the same transmission line.

Regional San's vision includes the increase in recycling by up to 30-40 mgd by 2024. The South Sacramento County Agriculture and Habitat Lands Recycled Water Program (South County Ag Program) that would provide drought-proof irrigation water to agriculture and habitat lands in south Sacramento County that are currently using ground and surface water, thus minimizing reliance on these water supplies. This program is anticipated to provide up to 50,000 acre-feet per year of Title 22 disinfected, tertiary-treated recycled water available from the EchoWater Project, for irrigation, in-lieu recharge, and habitat enhancement. This project has considerable stakeholder support. A draft environmental impact report for the project was released in July 2016, and in August 2016, Regional San filed a wastewater change petition with the State Water Resources Control Board for the project. Regional San is also planning an expansion of recycled water deliveries of up to 260 acre-feet in the East Franklin and Laguna Ridge

areas of Elk Grove, which may be facilitated by transmission facilities for the South County Ag Program.
