

estate in real property is to be sold under such a power of sale or execution upon a judgment a copy of said notice shall be posted in some conspicuous place on the real property in which such a leasehold estate was demised, at least 20 days before date of sale. The term newspaper of general circulation as used herein is as defined in Article 1 (commencing with Section 6000) of Chapter 1, Division 7, Title 1 of the Government Code.

4. When the judgment under which the property is to be sold is made payable in a specified kind of money or currency, the several notices required by this section must state the kind of money or currency in which bids may be made at such sale, which must be the same as that specified in the judgment.

SEC. 2. The amendments set forth in Section 1 hereof are merely declaratory of existing law and are not to be construed as changes in the construction of said law prior to the amendment hereof.

CHAPTER 392

An act declaring the interest of the people of the state in the Salton Sea and creating the Salton Sea Advisory Committee, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

[Approved by Governor June 26, 1968. Filed with Secretary of State June 26, 1968.]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The term "Salton Sea" as used in this act includes the area of the Salton Sea and lands adjacent thereto.

SEC. 2. The Legislature finds and declares that the primary use of the Salton Sea area is for collection of agricultural drainage, seepage, leaching and control waters.

SEC. 3. The Legislature further finds and declares that other uses of the Salton Sea include recreation and fish and wildlife development, enhancement, and preservation.

SEC. 4. There is hereby created the Salton Sea Advisory Committee, hereafter in this act referred to as the "committee."

SEC. 5. The committee shall consist of the following members:

(a) Six members appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County, two of whom shall be representatives of the County of Riverside and four of whom shall be interested members of the public.

(b) Six members appointed by the Board of Supervisors of Imperial County, two of whom shall be representatives of the County of Imperial and four of whom shall be interested members of the public.

(c) Two members appointed by the Board of Directors of the Coachella Valley County Water District.

(d) Two members appointed by the Board of Directors of the Imperial Irrigation District.

SEC. 6. The Boards of Supervisors of Riverside and Imperial Counties shall appoint to the extent feasible, as the public members of the committee, persons who shall represent farming, conservation and recreation, the owners of resort establishments located at or near the Salton Sea, and private landowners.

SEC. 7. The members of the committee shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing powers.

SEC. 8. The committee shall adopt its own rules of procedure and shall elect a chairman from among its members. The committee shall meet at such times and in such places as it may deem necessary.

SEC. 9. The Resources Agency shall keep the Salton Sea Advisory Committee fully informed on all matters pertaining to the Salton Sea and shall consult with and seek the advice of the advisory committee with respect to all such matters.

SEC. 10. This act is an urgency statute necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety within the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. The facts constituting such necessity are:

The problems of the Salton Sea relating to collection of agricultural drainage, seepage, leaching and control of its waters are such that they require immediate attention. It is therefore necessary that this act take immediate effect.

CHAPTER 393

An act to amend Section 18682 of, and to add Section 484 to, the Agricultural Code, relating to meat inspection, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 484 is added to the Agricultural Code, to read:

484. The director may enter into cooperative agreements with departments, divisions, bureaus, boards, or commissions of the United States for the purpose of administering meat or poultry meat inspection programs to protect the public from uninspected, adulterated, or misbranded meat and poultry meat and products thereof.
