

Dennis B. Underwood is Vice President with The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan) in Los Angeles. He directs Metropolitan's policy on its Colorado River resources and is actively involved in California's efforts to reduce its use of the Colorado. Prior to joining Metropolitan he headed his own consulting business. In 1989 he was appointed as Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation, U.S. Department of the Interior. Previously, he served as executive director and executive secretary of the Colorado River Board of California and with the California Department of Water Resources

Mr. Underwood has directed and managed programs involving large-scale transportation and utility infrastructure, water, energy, environmental protection, endangered species and numerous other matters having to do with the ecology and has been an advisor to business and governmental entities, including the United Nations.
