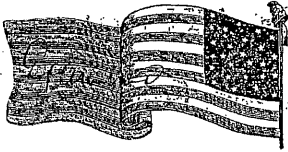

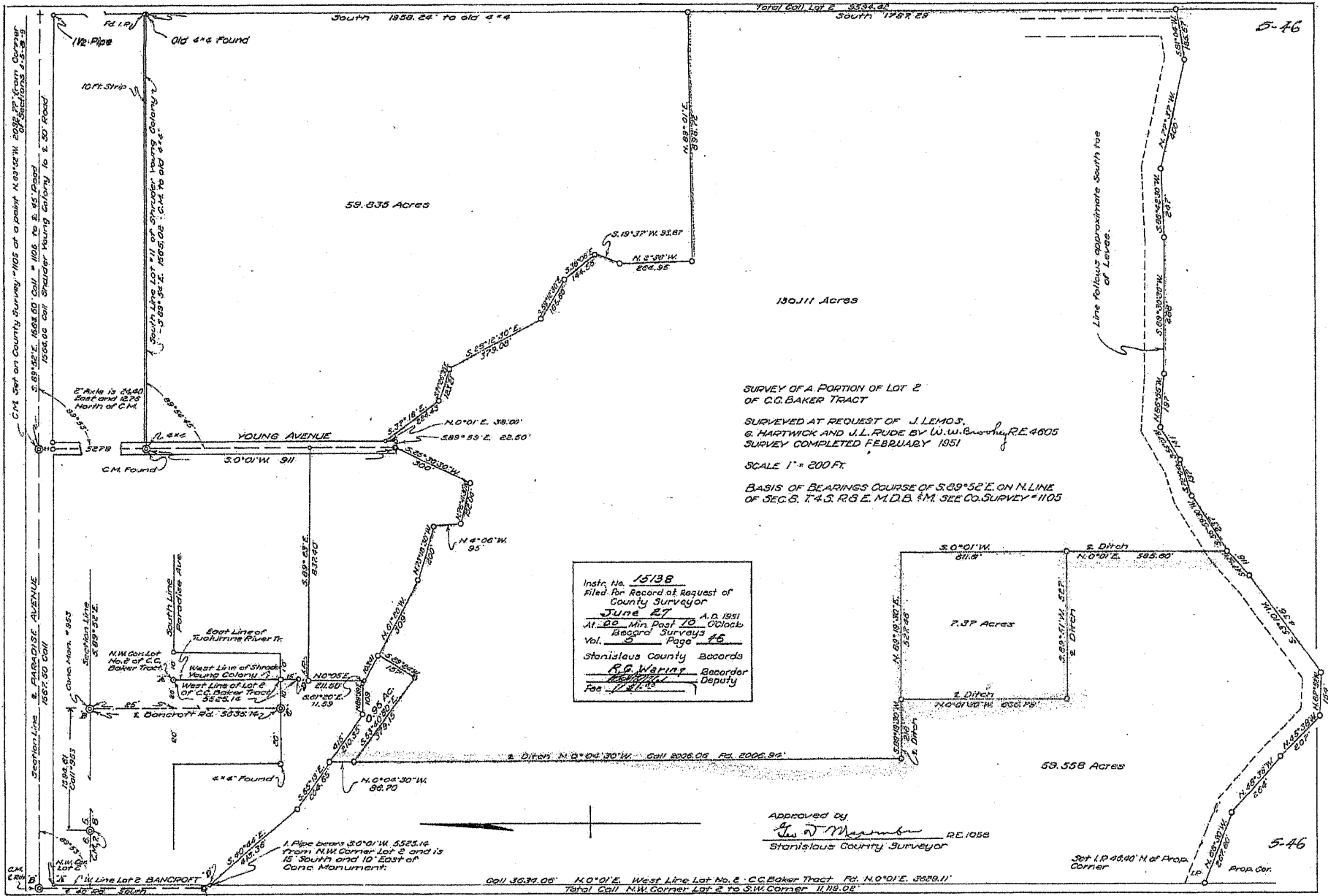

This is to certify that we have examined the application of which the foregoing is a true and correct copy and do hereby grant the same, subject to VESTED RIGHTS and the following limitations and conditions, in addition to those enumerated in Section 20 (Statutes 1913, Chapter 586) set forth above.

- The amount of water appropriated shall be limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, and shall not exceed two and fifty-four hundredths (2.54) cubic feet per second from about May 1st to about December 1st of each season. Diversions under this permit, together with those under existing rights of permittee herein which are to be directly applied to irrigation use without storage, shall not exceed the rate of one cubic foot per second continuous flow to each eighty acres of irrigated land; provided, however, that in case of rotation the equivalent of such continuous flow allowance for any thirty day period may be diverted in a shorter time if there be no interference with other vested rights.
- The maximum amount herein stated may be reduced in the license if investigation so warrants.
- Actual construction work shall begin on or before *June 1, 1927* and shall thereafter be prosecuted with reasonable diligence, and if not so commenced and prosecuted this permit may be revoked.
- Said construction work shall be completed on or before *July 1, 1929*
- Complete application of the water to the proposed use shall be made on or before *December 1, 1930*
- As the right of the United States to control streams in the interests of navigation is paramount, this permit will in no way hinder the United States if it desires to stop this diversion under claim of its interference with navigation.
- As there is a possibility that there will not be sufficient water in San Joaquin River during the latter part of the irrigation season to satisfy all requirements, this permit is issued subject to the express condition that the use hereunder may be regulated by the Division of Water Rights during such periods of water scarcity to the end that such use will not interfere with rights under prior applications.
