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environmental issues. My Statement of Qualifications is marked as MSS Exhibit 1A.

I, and other historians employed at JRP Historical Consulting, LLC working under my direct supervision, reviewed files of the San Joaquin County Recorder's office in Stockton to determine if Woods Irrigation Company filed a notice of appropriation for water diversion and use pursuant to the 1872 Civil Code. Neither I nor any other historians employed at JRP Historical Consulting located a notice.

In my review of the files of the San Joaquin County Recorder, I located a notice of appropriation for water diversion and use filed by T. C. McChesney on August 11, 1911. MSS Exhibit 1B is a true and correct copy of the T. C. McChesney Water Appropriation Notice contained in Miscellaneous Book G, volume 26, at page 569. On February 21, 1912, T. C. McChesney assigned this water right to the River View Land & Water Company. MSS Exhibit 1C is a true and correct copy of this assignment contained in Miscellaneous Book G, volume 27, at page 417. The water filing became the foundation for the water rights transferred on October 8, 1924 by the River View Land & Water Company to the Banta-Carbona Irrigation District. MSS Exhibit 1D is a true and correct copy of the deed for this transfer contained in the Official Records, volume 57, at page 87.

I also searched the California State Archives for historical records related to the litigation involving the Woods Irrigation Company, which was resolved in the California Supreme Court case Woods Irrigation Company v. Department of Employment, 50 Cal. 2d 174 (1958) (Exhibit PT-10). MSS Exhibit 1E is a true and correct copy of a transcript I obtained from the California State Archives taken at a trial on September 16, 1955 in the County of Sacramento Superior Court, which includes the "Certificate of Official Shorthand Reporter."

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
