Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has filed an application with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (Commission) for a new license to operate the DeSabla-Centerville Hydroelectric Project (Commission Project No. 803). The Commission license for the DeSabla-Centerville Hydroelectric Project (Project) was issued on June 11, 1980, and expired on October 11, 2009. The Project is located on Butte Creek and the West Branch of the Feather River and has an installed capacity of 26.7 megawatts. The Project includes the following: Round Valley Reservoir, Philbrook Reservoir, Hendricks Head Dam, Hendricks Canal, Toadtown Powerhouse, Butte Creek Diversion Dam, Butte Creek Canal, DeSabla Forebay, DeSabla Powerhouse, Lower Centerville Canal, Lower Centerville Diversion Dam, and Centerville Powerhouse.

The State Water Board is the lead agency for the purpose of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and has prepared a Draft Negative Declaration for the DeSabla-Centerville Hydroelectric Project, which will be released for public comment in the near future.
