

Re: COMMENT LETTER - 8/3/10 BOARD MEETING OROVILLE DRAFT WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION

Dear Ms. Townsend,

Please accept the City of Oroville's (City) recommendation to approve the application from the Department of Water Resources (DWR) for Water Quality Certification. The City is supportive of the requirements which include water, river, and lake protection ensuring that clean and safe water occurs. The City also supports the Feather River Fish Hatchery salmon mitigations as detailed in the Water Quality Certification.

The City Council, at its regular meeting on July 20, 2010, fully endorsed the DWR comment letter regarding the Oroville Draft Water Quality Certification.

The approval of the certification and the issuance of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission license will allow the funding of the Supplemental Benefits Fund (SBF) that is detailed in Appendix B of the Settlement Agreement for the licensing of the Oroville Facilities which was signed by over fifty (50) stakeholders on March 21, 2006.

that are intended to mitigate the impact of the Lake Oroville Facilities. The SBF was the culmination of a six-year collaborative process between DWR and stakeholder groups representing hundreds of interests to benefit environmental, recreational, cultural, land use, and operations resources.

We encourage a timely approval to DWR's certification application which is consistent to the Settlement Agreement and that changes detailed in the State Water Resources Control Board summary report are amended to match the DWR certification application.
