## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 72-20

COMMENDING THE NAVY FOR
DEVELOPING A PROGRAM
TO ELIMINATE DISCHARGES
FROM NAVAL VESSELS
AND
AMENDING RESOLUTION 72-1

## WHEREAS:

- 1. On January 6, 1972, the State Board adopted Resolution 72-1 requesting the U. S. Navy to develop a plan to provide for construction of facilities not later than 1976 to eliminate the discharge of vessel wastes to the waters of the State of California.
- 2. On March 6, 1972, the Commandant of the Eleventh Naval District presented a statement to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Diego Region, setting forth the Navy's staged program for eliminating all discharges of domestic and oil wastes to San Diego Bay and other waters of California prior to June 30, 1977. The program presented by the Navy will reduce waste loads to the waters of California in accordance with the following schedule:

FY 73 - Elimination of 6% of waste FY 74 - Elimination of 36% of waste FY 75 - Elimination of 66% of waste FY 76 - Elimination of 86% of waste FY 77 - Elimination of all waste

3. The State Board has reviewed the program submitted by the Navy and finds that the schedule sets forth a satisfactory program of pollution abatement for the waters of California.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that

- 1. The Navy is to be commended for its actions in developing a program for elimination of vessel waste discharges to the waters of the State.
- 2. The Navy is requested to provide specific schedules to each affected regional board by July 1, 1972, setting forth its program to eliminate its waste discharges to the waters of the region.
- 3. The State Board hereby amends Resolution 72-1, paragraph 2 of Resolved, changing the date for final completion of onshore transfer facilities and proper disposal of all waste discharges from vessels from 1976 to June 30, 1977.
