RESOLUTION NO. 76-110

RESOLUTION REGARDING THE ELEVATION OF
MONTEREY COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICE AREA
NO. 66 (LAS LOMAS-HALL) PROJECT ON THE
CLEAN WATER GRANTS PRIORITY LIST FOR
FISCAL YEAR 1976-77

WHEREAS:

1. The Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board has adopted a prohibition against further installation of individual disposal systems within the Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66, and has established a timetable for elimination of all discharges from such systems in that area by July 1, 1979; and
2. The State Board has approved that prohibition; and
3. The Monterey County Department of Environmental Health has documented the existence of a serious public health problem in the Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66; and
4. Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66 is presently an unsewered community and its wastewater treatment facilities project now qualifies for placement in Priority Class B in the State Board's Clean Water Grants Priority List for Fiscal Year 1976-77.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the State Board waive Section 2108(f) of the Clean Water Grant Regulations; and
2. That the Fiscal Year 1976-77 Clean Water Grants Priority List be amended to elevate the Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66 wastewater treatment facilities project from Priority Class F to Priority Class B; and
3. That the State Board hereby directs the Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66 to include in its Facilities Plan a discussion and analysis of all alternative solutions to its water quality problems including, but not limited to, construction of traditional community wastewater collection and treatment facilities, establishment of a septic tank maintenance district, institution of a septic tank rehabilitation program, and installation of alternative individual disposal systems; and

4. That no grant for Step 2 or Step 3 work be given for the Monterey County Community Service Area No. 66 wastewater treatment facilities project until the above alternative solutions are studied and analyzed to the satisfaction of the Division of Water Quality.
