## State Water Resources Control Board Resolution No. 85-97

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE AQUATIC HABITAT INSTITUTE AND AQUATIC HABITAT PLAN REGIONAL EFFECTS ELEMENT

## WHEREAS:

- 1. The State Board adopted Resolution No. 82-50 approving the "Plan for Assessing the Effects of Pollutants in the San Francisco Bay Estuary" (Plan) which identifies and discusses a Regional Effects Element as one of six study elements needed to provide information essential for establishing and revising water quality standards.
- 2. The State Board transferred project management of the Plan, with the exception of its Hydrodynamic Element, to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (Regional Board) and recommended the formation of the Aquatic Habitat Institute to assist in the Plan's implementation.
- 3. The Aquatic Habitat Institute was formed on the recommendation of the State Board to assist in the implementation of the Plan.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the State Board make available, on a dollar-for-dollar matching basis a sum not to exceed \$200,000 in FY 1985-86 for the implementation of the Regional Effects Element of the Plan and authorize the Executive Officer of the State Board to negotiate and execute the necessary interagency agreements or contracts to effect that implementation. Specifically, a dollar-for-dollar matching is required for contracting purposes except for contracting purposes with the United States Geological Survey which may provide matching in-kind services.

2. That the State Board make available, on a dollar-for-dollar matching basis, a sum not to exceed \$50,000 in FY 1985-86 for the Aquatic Habitat Institute to assist in the Plan's implementation and authorize the Executive Officer of the State Board to negotiate and execute the appropriate contract.
