STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 86-30

AUTHORIZING NEGOTIATION AND EXECUTION OF AN INTERAGENCY AGREEMENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME TO CONTINUE OPERATION OF THE MARINE MONITORING PROGRAM IN FY 1986-87

WHEREAS:

- 1. Provisions of the Clean Water Act and the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act require the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) to establish and coordinate a statewide water quality surveillance and monitoring program, including the marine environment, to measure compliance with State and federal water quality control objectives.
- 2. The State Board resolved in Resolution No. 83-87, adopted November 17, 1983, approving the revised "Ocean Plan", that "The State Board hereby declares its intent to require continual monitoring of the marine environment to assure that the Plan reflects the latest available data and that the water quality objectives fully protect the marine environment."
- 3. The State Board's State Mussel Watch Program is providing valuable information on the occurrence of toxic substances in the State's marine waters, including bay and estuaries.
- 4. The Department of Fish and Game has qualified personnel, facilities, and experience to continue operation of the marine program.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and execute an interagency agreement with the Department of Fish and Game for continued operation of the Marine Water Quality Monitoring Program through June 30, 1987, at a cost not to exceed \$225,000 in FY 1986-87 Bond fund monies, and up to \$120,000 in reimbursable funds, subject to availability of funds.
