RESOLUTION NO. 86-83

ACCEPTANCE OF THE 205(j) PHASE I REPORTS AS COMPLETION
OF THE MONTEREY COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION
DISTRICT'S "SALINAS VALLEY SEAWATER INTRUSION STUDY"

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to the terms of a Phase I 205(j) grant from the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) provided funds under Standard Agreement No. 3-073-225-4 to the Monterey County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) to conduct a ground water quality management planning project in the Salinas Valley.
2. The project provided for an investigation of the feasibility of preventing further seawater intrusion into the Salinas Valley ground water basin.
3. In completion of the 205(j) Phase I "Salinas Valley Seawater Intrusion Study" (Study), the District submitted to the State Board the following reports:
 - a. Salinas Valley Seawater Intrusion Study, January 1985.
 - b. Salinas Valley Ground Water Model, July 1986.
 - c. Documentation and Users Manual for FEGW-14, (Draft) July 1986.
4. The District's Board of Supervisors accepted the report entitled Salinas Valley Seawater Intrusion Study, with adoption of Resolution No. 86-353.
5. Under Phase II of the 205(j) program, the State Board funded a continuation of the subject Study and will consider acceptance of the continuation Study in the spring of 1987.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board:

1. Accepts the aforementioned reports as completion of the District's Phase I 205(j) project entitled "Salinas Valley Seawater Intrusion Study".

2. Authorizes final payment to the District under Standard Agreement No. 3-073-225-4.
3. Reserves final decision on approval of the Study's findings and recommendations until the ongoing Phase II continuation Study is submitted for State Board consideration.
