## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 88- 18

REDIRECTION OF \$144,100 SAVINGS IN STATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SAP) TO FUND THE KERN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM DEPARTMENT'S STUDY PROPOSAL PERTAINING TO RECLAMATION OF WASTE BRINE FROM NITRATE REMOVAL PLANTS

## WHEREAS:

- 1. The Clean Water and Water Conservation Bond Law of 1978 (Proposition 2) contained provisions for the expenditure of up to \$50 million to fund water pollution control, water conservation and wastewater reclamation needs in the State;
- The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) designated the disbursement of Proposition 2 grant funds as the State Assistance Program (SAP);
- 3. In March 1982, the State Board adopted a final project priority list and authorized expenditure of \$50 million for completion of 28 projects (18 water pollution control, 6 water conservation, and 4 water reclamation);
- Twenty-four projects have been completed (16 water pollution control, 5 water conservation, and 3 water reclamation);
- Some projects were completed below cost resulting in a total savings of \$1,535,661;
- 6. Of \$1,535,661 in SAP savings, \$645,000 were unencumbered from the SAP Project to fund the Bay-Delta studies through private consultants:
- 7. On March 20, 1986, the State Board adopted procedures (Resolution No. 86-23) to redirect the remaining savings of \$890,661;
- 8. The State Board redirected savings of \$100,000 to fund: (a) Selenium Control Project by the Department of Water Resources (\$50,000); and (b) Agro-Forestry Project pertaining to management of drainage water in the San Joaquin Valley by the Department of Food and Agriculture (\$50,000);
- To date, \$790,661 are available in SAP savings to the State Board for funding additional projects; also, additional savings may accrue as other projects are completed below cost;
- 10. On January 14, 1988, the Kern County Community Development Program Department submitted a study proposal pertaining to reclamation of waste brine from nitrate removal plants at an estimated total cost of \$176,744.

- 11. Of \$176,744, the Kern County Community Development Program Department will contribute \$32,644 of in kind services and has requested the State Board for a 100 percent SAP grant for the remaining eligible costs not exceeding \$144,100.
- 12. The State Board staff have reviewed the study and recommend its approval.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board approves the study pertaining to reclamation of waste brine from nitrate removal plants at a total cost of \$176,744 (\$144,100 in eligible costs and \$32,644 of in kind services) and authorizes:

- (a) the redirection of \$144,100 from savings in State Assistance Program to fund 100 percent of eligible costs of the study; and
- (b) the Executive Director or his designee to enter into contract and amendments thereof with the Kern County Community Development Program Department for the completion of the study.
