STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 92-81

ADOPTION OF THE FFY 1993 STATE REVOLVING FUND (SRF) LOAN PROGRAM PRIORITY LIST

WHEREAS:

- 1. The Division of Clean Water Programs has developed the FFY 1993 SRF Loan Program Priority List based on Regional Board and public input consistent with the Federal Clean Water Act;
- 2. The availability of funds under the SRF program and the interest expressed for developing and implementing nonpoint source, storm drainage pollution, and estuary enhancement programs and projects support the expansion of the fundable portion of the FFY 1993 Priority List;
- 3. It is expected that the FFY 1993 appropriations bill will allow the States to fund major sewer system rehabilitation (Needs Category IIIB), new collection system (Needs Category IVA), and combined sewer overflow projects (Needs Category V) projects without limitation;
- 4. The State Water Board established a \$20 million cap on projects in FFY 1992 and the need exists to continue the cap for FFY 1993 to assure a reasonable distribution of the available funds; and
- 5. The Federal Clean Water Act allows the States to reserve four percent of their annual SRF allotment for loan administration.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That The State Water Board:

- 1. Approves the placement of Priority Classes A through E on the fundable portion of the FFY 1993 Priority List;
- 2. Approves funding in FFY 1993 for new collection system and combined sewer overflow projects.
- 3. Defers funding for major sewer rehabilitation projects for FFY 1993 and directs that these projects be placed on the unscheduled portion of the list;
- 4. Approves the use of a \$20 million funding limit (cap) on the amount of federal funds that any one agency can receive from FFY 1993 funds;
- 5. Approves the set-aside of four percent of the FFY 1993 Capitalization Grant amount for SRF Loan Program administration; and

6. Adopts the FFY 1993 SRF Loan Program Priority List.
