NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

TO RECEIVE COMMENT ON THE REVISED DRAFT STATEWIDE PROGRAM EIR COVERING GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR BIOSOLIDS LAND APPLICATION

The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) is proposing to adopt a General Order (GO) for General Waste Discharge Requirements for Biosolids Land Application for beneficial use in agricultural, silvicultural, horticultural, and reclamation activities. Biosolids are sewage sludge that has been treated, tested, and shown to be capable of beneficial use as a soil amendment. The GO would establish a notification and permit review process applicable to all persons and public entities intending to apply biosolids to land in California for the purposes stated above. The GO would establish prohibitions, discharge and application specifications, transportation and storage requirements, and general procedures and provisions to which all land appliers would be required to adhere.

The Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) was previously certified in 2000. Litigation brought against the SWRCB by Kern County and the Central Delta Water Agency after approval of the GO has resulted in the revision of the original PEIR. The court generally found the 2000 PEIR to be adequate, but concluded that two of the project alternatives were dismissed from detailed analysis without sufficient grounds. The court ordered decertification of the PEIR and set aside the approval of the GO pending revision and recertification of the PEIR with additional analyses of the two alternatives.

The two additional alternatives now analyzed in detail are: (1) the Class A Only Alternative; and (2) the Food Crop Limitation Alternative. Class A biosolids are treated through a variety of methods to achieve pathogen reduction. The Food Crop Limitation Alternative restricts the application of all biosolids (including Class A) to specified crops.

Chapter 14 of the revised Draft PEIR contains the additional alternative analysis. New information has become available since certification of the original PEIR has been added. Other sections have been updated to reflect changes in the regulatory environment since the previous certification.

The SWRCB will hold a public hearing on March 2, 2004 to receive comments on the additional analyses of the two alternatives in the revised Draft PEIR. Changes made in the 2000 PEIR are identified in the revised Draft and comments should be limited to the new and revised sections. The SWRCB will consider certification of the revised PEIR at a future meeting.
