SUBJECT

UPDATE ON THE PUBLIC PARTICIPATION INPUT RECEIVED ON THE DRAFT BENEFICIAL USE DEFINITIONS PERTAINING TO TRIBAL TRADITIONAL AND CULTURAL USE, TRIBAL SUBSISTENCE FISHING USE, AND SUBSISTENCE FISHING USE.

DISCUSSION

On February 16, 2016, the State Water Board adopted <u>Resolution No. 2016-0011</u> directing State Water Board staff to

- 1. Develop proposed beneficial use categories, including definitions, pertaining to tribal traditional and cultural use, tribal subsistence fishing use, and subsistence fishing use by other cultures of individuals.
- 2. Consider the beneficial uses presented in Attachment A of the resolution when developing the aforementioned proposed beneficial use categories.
- 3. Utilize the applicable public participation process when developing the proposed beneficial use categories and seek input from representatives of tribes, environmental justice organizations, the regulated community and all other interested entities and individuals. The Board further directed staff, after conducting the public participation process, to inform the Board (no later than the end of summer 2016) on the input received in order to obtain further direction from the board.

Starting with the beneficial use definitions proposed in Attachment A of Resolution No. 2016-0011, Board staff developed draft definitions for Tribal Traditional and Cultural Use, Tribal Subsistence Fishing Use and Subsistence Fishing Use. Staff convened a series of focused outreach meetings with interested parties including representatives from tribes, California water agencies, industrial permittees, publicly owned treatment works (POTWs), stormwater regulatory agencies, non-governmental organizations (NGO)s, environmental organizations, and agriculture, dairy, and livestock interests.

Board staff will present a summary of the findings and comments received from the outreach efforts.
