SUBJECT

WORKSHOP ON PROPOSED REGULATORY FRAMEWORK FOR MAKING WATER CONSERVATION A CALIFORNIA WAY OF LIFE.

DISCUSSION

On May 31, 2018, Governor Brown signed two bills, <u>Senate Bill (SB) 606 (Hertzberg)</u> and <u>Assembly Bill (AB) 1668 (Friedman)</u>. Referred to as the 2018 conservation legislation, these bills reflect the dedicated work of many water suppliers, environmental organizations, and members of the Legislature. Added by the 2018 conservation legislation, Water Code section 10609 et seq. required the Department of Water Resources to provide recommendations on and the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) to adopt standards for the efficient use of water, variances for unique uses that can have a material effect on water use, performance measures for commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) water use, and guidelines and methodologies that identify how each urban retail water supplier (supplier) will calculate an urban water use objective.

Prior to consideration for adoption by the Board, State Water Board staff will develop a draft regulation establishing the standards, variances, methodologies for calculating the urban water use objective, performance measures, and related reporting requirements. The regular rulemaking process for that regulation will begin soon. Before beginning, the State Water Board will hold a public workshop to discuss and receive verbal and written comments on the staff's proposed framework to Make Water Conservation a California Way of Life.
